Notice of Changes in Methods and Standards for Medicaid Payments for Hospitals, Ambulatory Surgical Centers, Physicians, and Limited License Practitioners

In accordance with public notice requirements of 42 CFR 447.205 and Section 1902(a)(13(A) of the Social Security Act, the Indiana Family and Social Services Administration (FSSA), Office of Medicaid Policy and Planning (OMPP) publishes this notice of proposed changes to the reimbursement methodology for Medicaid services provided by enrolled hospitals, ambulatory surgical centers, physicians, and limited license practitioners.

OMPP proposes to modify reimbursement under the Medicaid state plan and state regulations at 405 IAC 1-8-3 and 405 IAC 1-11.5-2 to set forth the following other provider-preventable conditions for nonpayment: wrong surgical or other invasive procedure performed on a patient; surgical or other invasive procedure performed on the wrong body part; surgical or other invasive procedure performed on the wrong patient. These changes are expected to result in an estimated total annual state savings of approximately \$700 (the federal share is approximately \$500). These changes shall be effective July 1, 2012.

This change in reimbursement is necessary to ensure that payment is not made for other provider-preventable conditions. On June 6, 2011, CMS published a final rule in the Federal Register at 76 FR 32816 requiring that states implement a policy for other provider-preventable conditions no later than July 1, 2012.
