Emergency Rule LSA Document #19-645(E)

DIGEST

Temporarily adds a list of convictions of concern and related provisions, implementing <u>IC 25-1-1.1-6</u>. Statutory authority: <u>IC 25-1-1.1-6</u>. Effective December 5, 2019.

SECTION 1. This document implements <u>IC 25-1-1.1-6</u> regarding convictions of concern for licensure by the home inspectors licensing board, and includes in SECTION 4 of this document an explicit list of crimes that may disqualify an individual from receiving a license.

SECTION 2. An applicant for licensure who has a conviction of concern may still be granted a license based on the criteria stated in IC 25-1-1.1-6(h).

SECTION 3. This document and <u>IC 25-1-1.1-6</u> do not limit the authority of the home inspector licensing board to issue a license on probation if appropriate under <u>IC 25-1-11-19</u> or any other applicable statute.

SECTION 4. This SECTION contains the list of disqualifying crimes as follows:

- (1) Child molesting, under IC 35-42-4-3.
- (2) Murder, under IC 35-42-1-1.
- (3) Rape, under IC 35-42-4-1.
- (4) Voluntary manslaughter, under IC 35-42-1-3.

SECTION 5. A crime in any other jurisdiction for which the elements of the crime for which conviction was entered are substantially similar to the elements of a crime included on the list in SECTION 4 of this document shall also be a crime that may disqualify an individual from receiving a license and therefore included on the list.

SECTION 6. The fee for a petition under <u>IC 25-1-1.1-6(g)</u> for a determination as to whether the individual's misdemeanor or felony conviction will disqualify the individual from receiving a license or certification shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25).
