There are no private residences or small businesses landward of where these restrictions apply. Since the entire shoreline within this area of the lake is undeveloped there are no moored boats, piers, lifts, etc. on the portion of shoreline affected by this rule so marinas and lake service providers will not be affected.

Small businesses are not impacted by this rule because there is no service they would be asked to provide within the regulated areas. There is no reporting, record keeping, or other administrative costs associated with this rule.
