## Notice of Changes in Methods and Standards for Medicaid Payments for Inpatient Hospital Services

In accordance with public notice requirements of 42 CFR 447.205 and Section 1902(a)(13)(A) of the Social Security Act, the Indiana Family and Social Services Administration (FSSA) Office of Medicaid Policy and Planning (OMPP) publishes this notice of proposed changes to the reimbursement methodology for Medicaid payments for inpatient hospital services.

The OMPP proposes to allow the three percent (3%) rate reduction for inpatient hospital services to expire as scheduled on June 30, 2021. This change applies to inpatient hospital services under the Medicaid State Plan and state regulations at 405 IAC 1-10.5. The last extension of this 3% rate reduction was announced in BT202010.

It is estimated that the fiscal impact of ending the three percent (3%) rate reduction will be annual cost increases of approximately \$0.4 million for SFY 2021 (federal share of \$0.3 million and state share of \$0.1 million) and \$0.4 million for SFY 2022 (federal share of \$0.3 million and state share of \$0.1 million).
