Under <u>IC 4-22-2-23</u>, the Bureau of Motor Vehicles intends to adopt a rule concerning the following:

OVERVIEW: Amends <u>140 IAC 6-1-2</u>, <u>140 IAC 7-1.1-1</u>, and <u>140 IAC 7-1.1-3</u> to allow the BMV to issue a driver's license, a permit, an identification card, registrations, or certificates of title to an individual granted parole to remain in the United States under 8 U.S.C. 1182(d)(5). The proposed amendments bring <u>140 IAC</u> into conformity with the changes to <u>IC 9</u> as a result of the passage of House Bill 1050 (2023). Effective 30 days after filing with the Publisher.
