REQUIREMENTS TO PRACTICE AS A FORENSIC NURSE; CONTINUING EDUCATION

PURPOSE OF NOTICE

The Indiana State Board of Nursing (board) is soliciting public comment on adding rules at <u>848 IAC 1-2-25</u> concerning requirements to practice as a forensic nurse, and continuing education for forensic nurses. The board seeks comment on the affected citations listed and any other provisions of Title 848 that may be affected by this rulemaking.

OVERVIEW

Basic Purpose and Background

The forensic nurse license is a new license type created by <u>IC 25-23-1-35</u>, which outlines the requirements for individuals to practice as a forensic nurse. The statute requires that individuals who wish to practice as a forensic nurse complete a biennial forensic nursing educational program. The statute requires the board to determine the criteria and requirements for biennial continuing education for a sexual assault nurse examiner, which is why the board needs to promulgate a rule.

PROPOSED RULE

SECTION 1. 848 IAC 1-2-25 IS ADDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS:

848 IAC 1-2-25 Requirements to practice as a forensic nurse; continuing education

Authority: <u>IC 25-23-1-35</u> Affected: <u>IC 25-23-1-35</u>

Sec. 25. (a) For purposes of <u>IC 25-23-1-35(a)(2)(B)</u>, "substantially equivalent" means:

(1) an out-of-state sexual assault nurse examiner (SANE) training program offering didactic and clinical components meeting the requirements of <u>IC 25-23-1-35(a)(2)(A)</u>;

(2) a graduate degree program in forensic nursing, offering clinical and didactic components meeting the requirements of $\frac{1225-23-1-35}{(a)(2)(A)}$; or

(3) a SANE training course approved by the International Association of Forensic Nurses in addition to clinical components meeting the requirements of <u>IC 25-23-1-35(a)(2)(A)</u>.

(b) A candidate program intending to apply for board approval shall submit a completed application on forms provided by the board, and request an appearance before the board. The application must include evidence of resources necessary to start a program, including:

(1) the address for the program;

(2) the identities and qualifications of faculty;

(3) curriculum requirements; and

(4) the number of clinical and didactic hours in the program.

(c) After an appearance with the candidate program, the board shall approve or disapprove the application for program approval based on evidence:

(1) submitted in the application; and

(2) presented at the board appearance.

(d) This subsection applies to individuals whose registered nurse license has not been renewed since submitting a certificate of completion of a SANE training program as follows:

(1) For an individual who submitted an initial proof of completion of a SANE program less than twelve (12) months before the expiration date of their underlying registered nurse license, continuing education is not required.

(2) For an individual who submitted an initial proof of completion of a SANE program at least twelve (12) months before the expiration date of their underlying registered nurse license, the individual shall submit proof of completion of at least six (6) contact hours of continuing education along with their registered nurse renewal application.

(e) This subsection applies to an individual whose underlying registered nurse license has been renewed at least once since submitting a certificate of completion of a SANE program. The individual shall submit proof of completion of twelve (12) contact hours of continuing education along with their registered nurse renewal application.

(f) Contact hours of continuing education must be approved by a nationally approved sponsor of continuing education for nurses and be relevant to the practice of a forensic nurse, as determined by the board.
