I. STATUTORY DIRECTIVE

The Central State Advisory Committee (CSAC) was created by P.L. 40-1994. The Committee is charged with the responsibility of developing the best use of the Central State property. The CSAC is to act upon any recommendations of the Governor concerning the selling, leasing, or transferring possession of any part of the real property constituting the grounds of Central State Hospital. SB 215-1998 amended the original legislation to require the Committee to obtain the following information:

- (1) The number of adults with mental illness and adults with mental retardation.
- (2) The number of adults with mental illness and adults with mental retardation confined by the Department of Correction (DOC).
- (3) The number of adults with mental illness and adults with mental retardation who will be released by the DOC and require services for mental illness or services for mental retardation.
- (4) The number of adults with mental illness and adults with mental retardation in county jails.
- (5) The number of adults with mental illness who will require services for mental illness.
- (6) The number of adults with mental illness who require services but will not receive adequate services and the reasons for the lack of needed services.
- (7) Classification of mental illness and the associated numbers of adults with mental illness within each classification.
- (8) The requirements for services, including the types of placements needed, for all adults with mental illness.
- (9) The number of beds required to serve adults with mental illness.

SB 215-1998 also requires the Committee to do the following:

- (1) Study the private services available for adults within each classification of mental illness and compare the cost of private services with the cost of state institutionalized care.
- (2) Study funding and other fiscal issues related to providing appropriate service to adults with mental illness.
- (3) Study administrative issues related to providing appropriate services to adults with mental illness.
- (4) Study the need for institutional care for adult individuals with mental illness at the site of Central State Hospital.
- (5) Study alternative forms of treatment and sentencing for adult offenders with mental retardation, including specialized services that may be provided in correctional facilities or other facilities.

II. SUMMARY OF WORK PROGRAM

The Committee met two times during the 1999 interim session on October 12, 1999, and October 27, 1999.
