**Digest of Proposed Rule:** This rule amends 329 IAC 3.1-1-7 pertaining to the hazardous waste management program to achieve consistency with federal hazardous waste management regulations by incorporating by reference 21 changes to 40 CFR 260 through 40 CFR 270 that were issued by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) between June 13, 1997, through February 1, 1999. This rule amends 329 IAC 3.1-7-3 to add a provision for exempting transport of hazardous waste on rights-of way on contiguous properties from manifest requirements that was omitted from LSA Document #97-300.

**Governmental Entities:**

State: These amendments will be incorporated into the existing hazardous waste rules at 329 IAC 3.1 and will be administered by the existing hazardous waste program staff. This rule will result in no increase in resources needed by state government over and above the resources already allocated. There are no unfunded mandates placed upon any state agency by this rule.

Local: There are no unfunded mandates placed upon any local government by this rule.

**Regulated Entities:**

This rule applies to generators of hazardous waste in Indiana and to facilities in Indiana that treat, store, or dispose of hazardous waste. The estimated impact below includes annual impacts as well as impacts beginning with the effective date of the rule through the life of the rule, which expires after seven years.

Savings:

Land Disposal Restrictions Phase IV (sets treatment standards for metal-bearing wastes; amends treatment standards for contaminated soils; excludes certain recycled circuit boards and some recycled wood preserving wastes)	\$840,000 (7-year impact) \$120,000 (annual impact)
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Hazardous Waste Combusters (excludes fuels produced from hazardous waste that are comparable to fossil fuels)	\$1,120,000 to \$3,220,000 (7-year impact) \$160,000 to \$460,000 (annual impact)
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Hazardous Waste Combusters (modifies permit rules to make permit changes earlier; extends compliance period to allow installation of cost effective pollution prevention technology)  
Cost savings indeterminable at this time.

Hazardous Remediation Waste Management (streamlines the permitting process for treatment, storage, and disposal of remediation wastes generated at cleanup sites)  
\$700,000 to \$4,900,000 (7-year impact)  
\$100,000 to \$700,000 (annual impact)

Costs:

Petroleum Refining Process Waste (temporarily excludes landfill leachate and landfill gas condensate derived from listed petroleum refinery wastes)  
\$13,000 to \$28,000 (possible costs after February 13, 2001)  
\$2,600 to \$5,600 (annual impact)

Net Impact:

Savings: \$2,632,000 to \$8,947,000 (7-year impact)  
\$374,400 to \$1,277,400 (annual impact)
