RESOLUTIONS ON FIRST READING

Senate Concurrent Resolution 8

Senate Concurrent Resolution 8, introduced by Senators Lubbers, Gard, Hershman, Landske, Breaux, Lanane, and Rogers:

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION to recognize the success of the "Walk A Mile" program in educating policymakers and constituents alike on participatory democracy.

Whereas, The "Walk A Mile" project is a national educational program that links policymakers with their low-income constituents to learn more about each others' lives, gain new perspectives, and "walk a mile" in each others shoes;

Whereas, Begun in Washington State in 1994, the program is rooted in the principle that greater personal understanding of issues facing low-income individuals by policymakers will lead to the development of sound public policy;

Whereas, The "Walk a Mile" program was brought to the State of Indiana by the Indiana Association for Community Economic Development, a statewide association dedicated to strengthening Indiana's communities by supporting local organizations engaged in community and economic development;

Whereas, From mid-November through mid-December 2004, twenty-six policymaker/constituent matches were made around the State of Indiana; and

Whereas, Indiana "Walk A Mile" partners shared life experiences through weekly telephone calls and participating in life activities typical for each party. In addition, policymakers were asked to adhere to a food stamp budget to feed their families during the program: Therefore,

Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, the House of Representatives concurring:

SECTION 1. That the members of the Indiana General Assembly recognize the "Walk A Mile" program for its educational benefits for both policymakers and constituents in the State of Indiana.

SECTION 2. The Secretary of the Senate is hereby directed to transmit a copy of this Resolution to the Indiana Association for Community Economic Development.

The resolution was read in full and adopted by voice vote. The Chair instructed the Secretary to inform the House of the passage of the resolution. House sponsor: Representative Ayres.

Senate Concurrent Resolution 1

Senate Concurrent Resolution 1, introduced by Senator Meeks:

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION to memorialize and honor Senator Charles "Bud" Meeks.

Whereas, Charles "Bud" Meeks graduated from Central High School in Fort Wayne in 1954;

Whereas, Upon graduation, Bud enlisted in the United States Navy where he served until 1958. During this period, in 1955, he

became betrothed to the love of his life, Marjorie Crews and she presented him with his loving son, Brian, on December 17, 1960;

Whereas, In 1990, Bud retired from the Indiana Air Guard's 122nd Tactical Fighter Wing at Fort Wayne International Airport as a Lieutenant Colonel with over 24 years of service;

Whereas, From 1975 to 1982, Bud Meeks served as the Sheriff of Allen County. During this time he also attended and graduated from the FBI National Police Academy;

Whereas, Later in life, Bud became the Executive Director of the National Sheriff's Association in Washington, D.C., served as advisor to three Presidents on law enforcement issues, and during his distinguished tenure, he established the National Sheriff's Institute;

Whereas, As a State Senator, constituents were Bud's number one priority. A believer in representative government, he relied on constituent feedback to formulate legislation. Throughout his service, Bud constantly pursued legislation beneficial to Northeast Indiana;

Whereas, Even toward the end of his life, Bud embraced every opportunity to teach young people the value of democracy. For six years, he schooled hundreds of pages on the details of the legislative process, often entertaining them with humorous anecdotes;

Whereas, Bud Meeks was diagnosed with colon cancer in 2002 and underwent surgery in both November, 2002 and January, 2004. Throughout his treatment, Bud remained optimistic and hoped to return to the Senate once again to serve the people;

Whereas, As a beloved statesman and teacher, Senator Charles "Bud" Meeks leaves an indelible mark on the people he met and the lives he touched; and

Whereas, Senator Charles "Bud" Meeks's accomplishments are inspiring to us all and he will be missed by everyone who had the privilege of knowing him. He is survived by his wife, Marjorie, his son, Brian, grandchildren Chad, Sarah, and Roy, and brothers Fred and Senator Robert Meeks: Therefore,

Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, the House of Representatives concurring:

SECTION 1. That the members of the Indiana General Assembly memorialize and honor the life of Senator Charles "Bud" Meeks.

SECTION 2. The Secretary of the Senate is hereby directed to transmit a copy of this Resolution to Marjorie Meeks, State Senator Robert Meeks and his family, Fred Meeks and his family, and Brian Meeks and his family.

The resolution was read in full and adopted by standing vote. The Chair instructed the Secretary to inform the House of the passage of the resolution. House sponsors: Representatives Alderman, Pond, Borrer, Espich, Moses, GiaQuinta, and Leonard.

COMMITTEE REPORT

Madam President: The Senate Committee on Rules and Legislative Procedure, pursuant to Standing Rule 33(b), begs leave to report on Standing Rules 21, 54, 88, 90, 91, 92, 93, 94, and 96 with the recommendation that said Rules be amended as follows:

21. The President Pro Tempore shall appoint the following:

- (a) (1) Assistant President Pro Tempore.
- (b) (2) Majority Floor Leader.
- (c) (3) Assistant Majority Floor Leader.
- (d) (4) Majority Whip.
- (e) (5) Assistant Majority Whip.
- (f) (6) Assistant Majority Caucus Chairman.
- (g) (7) Assistant Majority Secretary of the Senate.
- (h) (8) Deputy Minority Secretary of the Senate.
- (i) (9) Postmaster of the Senate.
- (j) (10) Principal Doorkeeper of the Senate.
- (k) (11) Majority Attorney of the Senate.
- (l) (12) Acting Principal Secretary of the Senate, if the Principal Secretary is removed, suspended, or unable to serve or resigns.

54. (a) Except as provided in Rule 54(b), all standing committee and subcommittee meetings shall be open to the public. The Senate's intent with this Rule is to provide public access to the legislative process without hindering, intimidating, or disrupting that process.

(b) The Committee on Ethics may meet in executive session:

- (1) as provided in IC 2-2.1-3-7; or
- (2) under Rule ~~92 or 93~~ **93 or 94** to consider the request of a Senator made under Rule ~~90~~ **91**.

88. A Senator who is offered:

- (a) (1) an economic or investment opportunity; or
- (b) (2) a loan, gratuity, discount, favor, hospitality, or other goods or services; by a person, shall consider, in determining whether or not to accept the offer, whether the Senator's acceptance of the offer may affect the Senator's independent legislative judgment. In so considering, the Senator shall take into account the following:

(+) (A) whether the opportunity is being offered with the intent to influence the Senator's conduct in the performance of legislative duties; or

(-) (B) whether acceptance of the offer would have a unique, direct, and material effect on the nonlegislative income of the Senator, a member of the Senator's immediate family or those of a partnership, corporation or business in which the Senator holds a legal or equitable interest.

Should the Senator determine that, by acceptance of the offer, the Senator's independent legislative judgment may be affected, the Senator shall refuse the offer.

90. During the course of a legislative session, a Senator may be placed in a position where the Senator has the obligation to vote on legislation in which the Senator has a direct personal or pecuniary interest. In making this decision pursuant to Rule 4 of the Standing Rules of the Senate and Orders for Government relative to the Senator's activity on the legislation, the Senator shall consider the

following:

(a) (1) Whether the Senator's interest in the legislation is so substantial as to affect the Senator's independence of judgment with respect to the legislation.

(b) (2) To what extent the Senator's interest in the legislation mirrors the interest of the citizenry to which the Senator is directly responsible.

(c) (3) The effect of the Senator's participation in the voting on the legislation on public confidence in the integrity of the legislature.

(d) (4) The need of the Senator's particular contribution, such as special knowledge of the subject matter, to the effective functioning of the legislature.

(e) (5) Whether the legislation would have a unique, direct, and material effect on the nonlegislative income of the Senator, a member of the Senator's immediate family or those of a partnership, corporation, or business in which the Senator holds a legal or equitable interest.

91. A Senator may request the assistance of the Senate Legislative Ethics Committee (established pursuant to IC 2-2.1-3-5) in determining the propriety of the Senator's:

- (a) (1) proposed acceptance of an offer;
- (b) (2) participation in upcoming debate; or
- (c) (3) participation in an upcoming vote.

92. Under Rule 91, the Senator shall:

(a) (1) Prepare a written statement describing the matter requiring action or decision by the Senator and the nature of the Senator's potential conflict of interest; and

(b) (2) Deliver a copy of the statement to the Chairman of the Senate Legislative Ethics Committee. If the Chairman is unavailable, a copy of the statement may be delivered to the President Pro Tempore.

~~93. The Legislative Ethics Committee shall meet as soon as possible and render an advisory opinion on the question raised. Should the committee vote result in a tie, the effect will be to make no recommendation.~~

94. 93. If a Senator requests the assistance of the Senate Legislative Ethics Committee under Rule 91, and there is insufficient time to comply with Rule 92, the Senator shall orally inform the Chairman of the Senate Legislative Ethics Committee of the potential conflict. The matter shall then be immediately referred to the Legislative Ethics Committee for its recommendation.

94. The Legislative Ethics Committee shall meet as soon as possible and render an advisory opinion on the question raised. Should the committee vote result in a tie, the effect will be to make no recommendation.

96. In addition to any meetings held under Rule ~~91~~, 94, the Senate Legislative Ethics Committee shall meet and may recommend amendments to the code of ethics for the Senate not later than thirty (30) days after the first session day of each legislative session, pursuant to IC 2-2.1-3-6.

(Reference is to the Senate Standing Rules and Orders adopted November 16, 2004.)

COMMITTEE REPORT

Madam President: The Senate Committee on Ethics has met pursuant to IC 2-2.1-3-6 to recommend a Code of Ethics for the Senate, and hereby recommends that Senate Rules 87 through 96 be amended and adopted as the Senate Code of Ethics as follows:

87. It is declared that high moral and ethical standards among State Senators are essential to the conduct of free government; that the Senate believes that a code of ethics for the guidance of State Senators will help them avoid conflicts of interest in public office, will improve standards of public service, and will promote and strengthen the faith and confidence of the people of Indiana. The code is intended to protect the individual Senators while providing guidelines for all members of the Senate.

Recognizing that service in the Indiana General Assembly is a part-time endeavor and that members of the General Assembly are individuals who are active in the affairs of their localities and elsewhere and that it is necessary that they maintain a livelihood and source of income apart from their legislative compensation, the following guidelines are adopted to assist the members in the conduct of their legislative duties.

88. A Senator who is offered:

- (1) an economic or investment opportunity; or
- (2) a loan, gratuity, discount, favor, hospitality, or other goods or services; by a person, shall consider, in determining whether or not to accept the offer, whether the Senator's acceptance of the offer may affect the Senator's independent legislative judgment. In so considering, the Senator shall take into account the following:

(A) whether the opportunity is being offered with the intent to influence the Senator's conduct in the performance of legislative duties; or

(B) whether acceptance of the offer would have a unique, direct, and material effect on the nonlegislative income of the Senator, a member of the Senator's immediate family or those of a partnership, corporation or business in which the Senator holds a legal or equitable interest.

Should the Senator determine that, by acceptance of the offer, the Senator's independent legislative judgment may be affected, the Senator shall refuse the offer.

89. A Senator who has a direct personal or pecuniary interest in a piece of legislation which is so substantial as to affect the Senator's independent legislative judgment is not precluded from participating in committee and floor debate on the legislation, if the Senator publicly proclaims that interest.

90. During the course of a legislative session, a Senator may be placed in a position where the Senator has the obligation to vote on legislation in which the Senator has a direct personal or pecuniary interest. In making this decision pursuant to Rule 4 of the Standing Rules of the Senate and Orders for Government relative to the Senator's activity on the legislation, the Senator shall consider the following:

(1) Whether the Senator's interest in the legislation is so substantial as to affect the Senator's independence of judgment with respect to the legislation.

(2) To what extent the Senator's interest in the legislation mirrors the interest of the citizenry to which the Senator is directly responsible.

(3) The effect of the Senator's participation in the voting on the legislation on public confidence in the integrity of the legislature.

(4) The need of the Senator's particular contribution, such as special knowledge of the subject matter, to the effective functioning of the legislature.

(5) Whether the legislation would have a unique, direct, and material effect on the nonlegislative income of the Senator, a member of the Senator's immediate family or those of a partnership, corporation, or business in which the Senator holds a legal or equitable interest.

91. A Senator may request the assistance of the Senate Legislative Ethics Committee (established pursuant to IC 2-2.1-3-5) in determining the propriety of the Senator's:

- (1) proposed acceptance of an offer;
- (2) participation in upcoming debate; or
- (3) participation in an upcoming vote.

92. Under Rule 91, the Senator shall:

(1) Prepare a written statement describing the matter requiring action or decision by the Senator and the nature of the Senator's potential conflict of interest; and

(2) Deliver a copy of the statement to the Chairman of the Senate Legislative Ethics Committee. If the Chairman is unavailable, a copy of the statement may be delivered to the President Pro Tempore.

93. If a Senator requests the assistance of the Senate Legislative Ethics Committee under Rule 91, and there is insufficient time to comply with Rule 92, the Senator shall orally inform the Chairman of the Senate Legislative Ethics Committee of the potential conflict. The matter shall then be immediately referred to the Legislative Ethics Committee for its recommendation. **The Committee shall issue an oral recommendation to the Senator making the request as soon as possible after considering the request. The Committee shall follow the oral recommendation with a written report as required by Senate Rule 95.**

94. The Legislative Ethics Committee shall meet as soon as possible and render an advisory opinion on the question raised. Should the committee vote result in a tie, the effect will be to make no recommendation.

95. The written report of the Legislative Ethics Committee shall be forwarded to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Senate Minority Leader. **Copies of the report and the written statement of the Senator making the request shall be maintained in the offices of the Majority Attorney and the Minority Attorney.** The committee's written report and the written statement of the Senator making the request under Rule 92 shall remain confidential unless the Senator making the request consents to their disclosure.

96. In addition to any meetings held under Rule 94, the Senate Legislative Ethics Committee shall meet and may recommend amendments to the code of ethics for the Senate not later than thirty (30) days after the first session day of each legislative session, pursuant to IC 2-2.1-3-6.

(Reference is to the Senate Standing Rules and Orders adopted on November 16, 2004.)

SENATE MOTION

Madam President: I move that, pursuant to Rule 33(b), the Standing Rules and Orders of the Senate for the 114th Indiana General Assembly be amended as follows:

4. (a) Every Senator shall vote on each question put except as provided by this Rule.

(b) A Senator, **by motion**, may **request to** be excused from voting on a question because of a direct personal or pecuniary interest in the event of such question. Whether a Senator has a direct personal or pecuniary interest so as to be excused from voting on a question shall be decided without debate.

(c) When presiding over the Senate, the President Pro Tempore or other Senator designated to preside shall not be required to vote unless necessary to break a tie or to provide a constitutional majority.

(d) This Rule shall not be construed as denying or abridging the right of a Senator to vote on any question.

15. (a) Each motion shall be in writing, signed by the maker, and, if demand is made, seconded, except the following motions:

Motion to adjourn.

Motion to fix the time which to adjourn.

Motion to lay on the table.

Motion for the previous question.

Motion to postpone indefinitely.

Motion to commit.

Motion to call the absentees.

Motion to excuse the absentees.

Motion to be excused from voting pursuant to Rule 4.

(b) Each written motion shall be handed to the Reading Clerk and read aloud before debate.

(c) After being read and stated by the President or Chair, a motion shall be in the possession of the Senate, but by consent of the Senate may be withdrawn at any time before being decided upon or amended.

(d) A motion to adjourn may be made only by the President Pro Tempore or Senator designated by the President Pro Tempore.
