RESOLUTIONS ON FIRST READING**House Concurrent Resolution 3**

Representatives C. Brown, Crawford, Dickinson, V. Smith, Porter, Harris, and Summers introduced House Concurrent Resolution 3:

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION honoring Hurley Goodall on the occasion of his retirement from the Indiana Arts Commission.

Whereas, Hurley Goodall, a lifelong resident of Muncie, Indiana, was born on May 23, 1927;

Whereas, He and his wife of 51 years, Fredine "Freddie" Goodall, have two sons - Hurley, Jr. and Frederick;

Whereas, Hurley Goodall is an Army veteran who served in Japan from 1945-1947 as a member of the United States Army Corps of Engineers, Pacific Theater;

Whereas, Hurley Goodall served in the Indiana House of Representatives from 1978 to 1992, serving as the Assistant Floor Leader from 1989 through 1992;

Whereas, Hurley Goodall has served his state in a variety of ways, some of which include chairing the Indiana Black Legislative Caucus (IBLC), serving as a Democratic National Convention Delegate in 1976, 1980, and 1992, and co-authoring a book in 1976 entitled A History of Negroes in Muncie;

Whereas, Hurley Goodall was first appointed to the Indiana Arts Commission by Governor Bayh in July, 1994, to fill an unexpired four-year term;

Whereas, Hurley Goodall was reappointed to the Arts Commission by Governor Bayh in July, 1996, to a full four-year term;

Whereas, While serving on the Arts Commission, Hurley Goodall played many roles, including chairman of the Program Evaluation Committee in 1997, chairman of the Cultural Trust Development Committee from 1997 to 1999, and secretary of the Arts Commission from 1998 to 1999;

Whereas, While a member of the Commission, Hurley Goodall was instrumental to the development of the Indiana Arts Commission Cultural Trust and the passage of the enabling legislation for the Cultural Trust;

Whereas, Hurley Goodall also took the lead in developing a system for the equitable distribution of IAC resources that led to the development of the Regional Partnership Initiative, a statewide network of 12 regional partners;

Whereas, Despite Hurley's busy schedule, he still finds the time to serve on the following boards: Channel 49 Public Television, the Delaware County Youth Service Bureau, First Merchants Bank of Muncie, the Leadership Academy of the Muncie Chamber of Commerce, the Muncie Area Growth Council, the Muncie chapter of the NAACP, the Muncie Children's Museum, the Muncie Delaware Foundation, and the Muncie School Board; and

Whereas, Hurley Goodall has spent his life helping others help themselves. His concern and his giving nature have touched the lives of many people in Delaware County and throughout the state of Indiana: Therefore,

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, the Senate concurring:

SECTION 1. That the Indiana General Assembly wishes to acknowledge the many contributions that Hurley Goodall has made to his community and his state on the occasion of his retirement from public service. We extend our best wishes to him and his family and hope that he will continue to fill his days with good works.

SECTION 2. That the Principal Clerk of the House of Representatives transmit a copy of this resolution to Hurley Goodall and his family.

The resolution was read a first time and adopted by voice vote. The Clerk was directed to inform the Senate of the passage of the resolution. Senate sponsors: Senators Breaux, Howard, Washington, Rogers, S. Smith, and Blade.
