Tips for Writing or Calling Your Legislator

Contact Legislators early in the legislative session.

January is the best time when all new bills are typically introduced.

Be brief and to the point. Focus on only one issue in each communication.

Identify a bill by number and title, if possible.

Use your own words and stationary.

Include your return address and phone number in all communications (even e-mail).
