BIO

Jessica M. Vaughan is Senior Policy Analyst for the **Center for Immigration Studies**, a Washington, DC-based research institute that examines the impact of immigration on American society and educates policymakers and opinion leaders on the need for more robust immigration law enforcement. She has been with the Center since 1992, and her area of expertise is immigration policy and operations, covering topics such as visa programs, immigration benefits and immigration law enforcement. She is currently the lead investigator for a Department of Justice-funded project studying the use of immigration law enforcement in transnational gang suppression efforts.

Prior to joining the Center, Mrs. Vaughan was a Foreign Service Officer with the State Department, where she served in consular and administrative assignments in U.S. embassies overseas. Her articles have appeared in the *Washington Post*, *The Economist*, *In the National Interest*, *Providence Journal*, *Hartford Courant* and other publications, and can be found at www.cis.org. She has testified before Congress several times and advises state lawmakers and agencies on immigration issues. She is frequently cited in news media reports on immigration, and has appeared on NPR, CNN and PBS's *NewsHour with Jim Lehrer*.

Mrs. Vaughan has a Master's degree from Georgetown University and earned her Bachelor's degree in International Studies at Washington College in Maryland. She telecommutes to her job in Washington, DC from her home in Franklin, Massachusetts, where she lives with her husband and four children.
