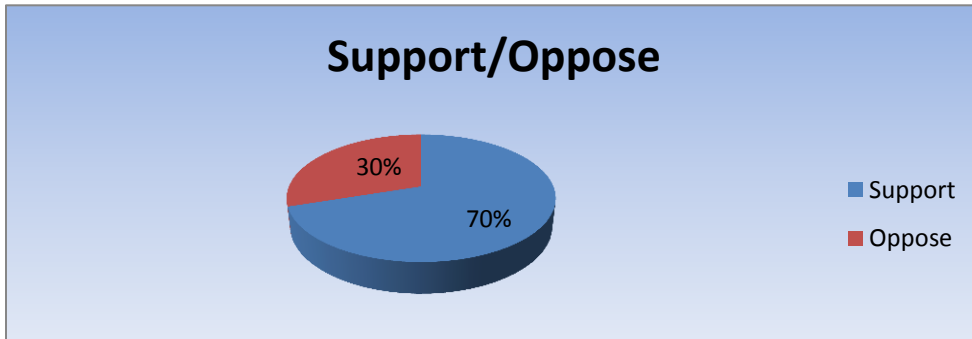


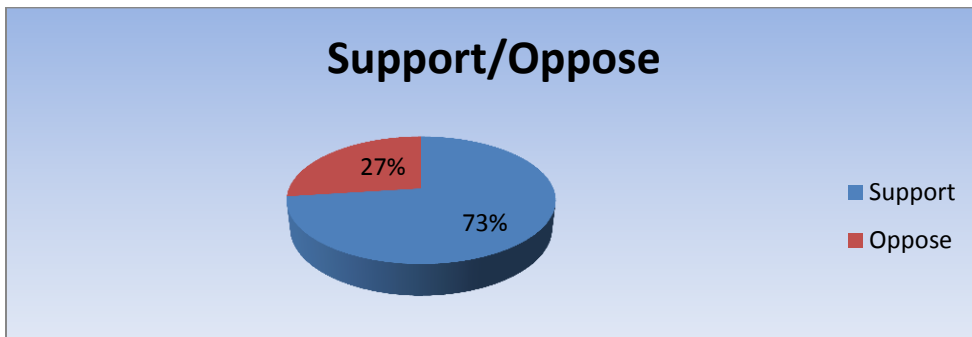
State Senator Luke Kenley's 2012 Legislative Survey Results

Mailed Survey Results:

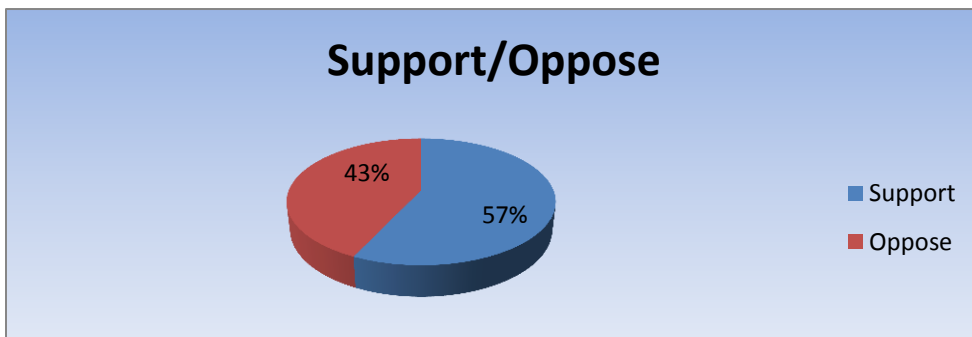
1. Would you support or oppose changing Indiana law to make employee contributions to unions voluntary, rather than mandatory?



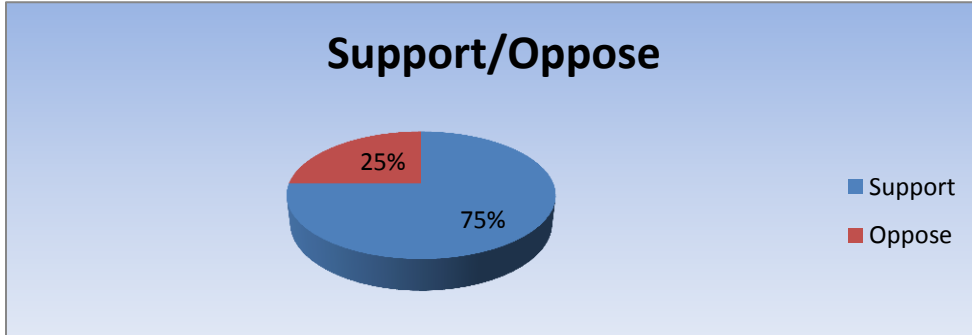

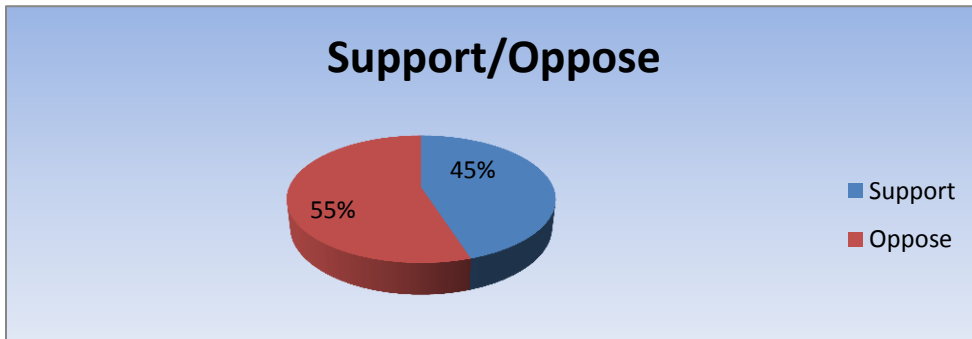
3. Would you support or oppose adding online courses to Indiana's high-school graduation requirements in an effort to prepare students for college and the 21st-century workforce?



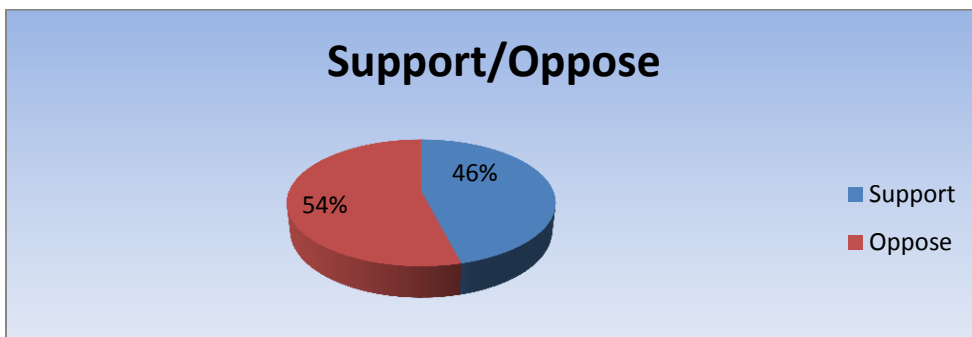
4. Would you support or oppose legislation prohibiting government employees from serving as elected officials for the unit of government that employs them?

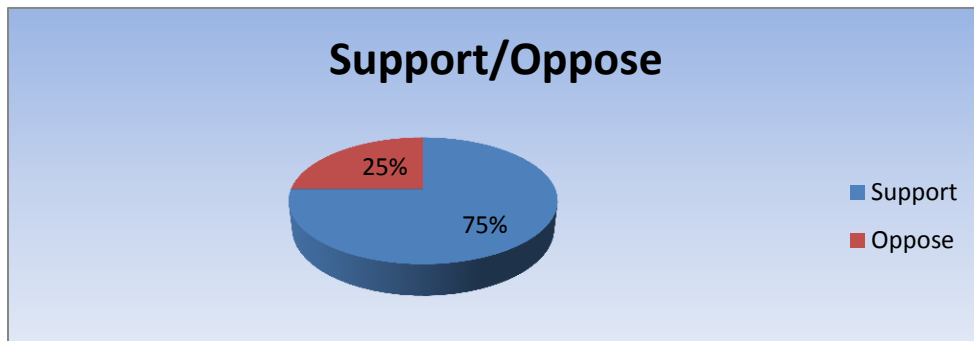


6. Would you support or oppose a light rail system from Noblesville to downtown Indianapolis knowing it could require an increase of up to 0.3 percent in the local option income tax?

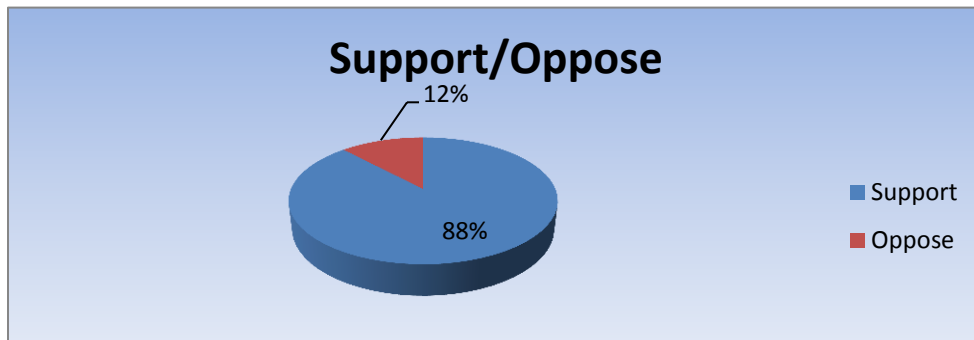

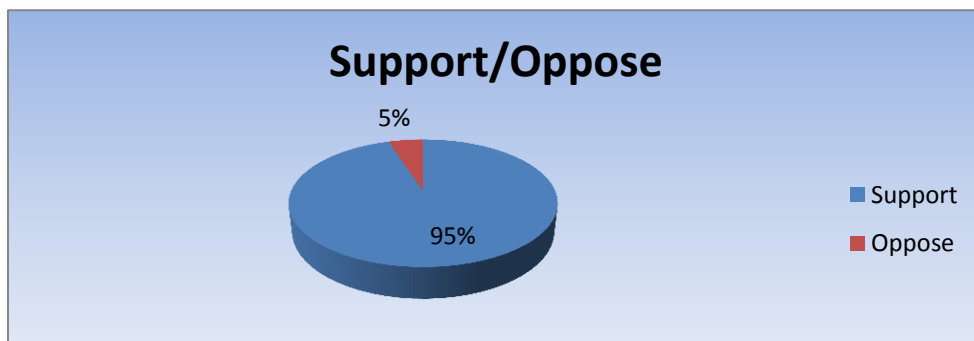
1. Would you support or oppose accelerating state intervention for schools that repeatedly fail annual performance standards?



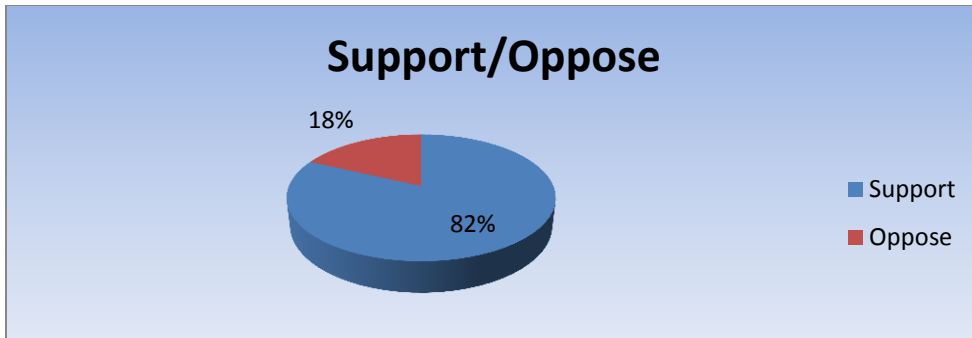
2. Would you support or oppose legislation prohibiting government employees from serving as elected officials for the unit of government that employs them?
