The Talking Book and Braille Library provides materials to any Hoosier who cannot use regular print because of a visual or physical disability, at no cost. Eligibility requirements and an application form are available through the Indiana State Library web site.

What We Do:

- Circulate books in audio format, Braille, and large print to eligible Hoosiers, **FREE** of charge.
- Provide magazines in special formats for those who cannot read standard print.
- Maintain a small reference collection on disabilities and services to provide reference and referral services to people with disabilities.
- Provide specialized children's services, including a summer reading program, and a newsletter for parents and educators.
- Publish a regular newsletter, Indiana Insights, distributed to over 8,000 agencies and individuals around Indiana.
