

KILL-A-WATT – FAQs



Q: When will the program begin?

A: *You can begin loaning the Kill-A-Watt Power Meter as soon as you receive and catalogue each unit.*

Q: Who should be trained? Directors, front-line staff?

A: *No training is necessary. We recommend that front desk and reference staff get familiar with the meters to better assist patrons with questions.*

Q: How long can a customer keep the meter?

A: *Normal time as a book. A one or two-day rental (i.e. DVD) will not be sufficient.*

Q: Will these items appear in our catalog?

A: *Yes. A MARC record exists for the Kill-A-Watt Power Meter. You can view this record in the [Evergreen Indiana](#) shared catalogue and [WorldCat](#).*

Q: Are there fines & fees attached to the items?

A: *This is left up to each respective library's discretion. We suggest levying your standard fines for books or A/V materials.*

Q: What if a meter is damaged, lost or stolen?

A: *Your public library owns the meters and may decide to recuperate costs associated with lost or damaged meters in the same fashion as other borrowable library property. A Kill-A-Watt is approximately \$17-\$20 to replace.*
