Lucinda Jean Arthur was born May 13, 1916 in Greensburg, Pennsylvania. Her parents were Dr. W.D. Hays and Ida Stevenson Hays. Her extensive education includes an A.B. from Seton Hill University in Pennsylvania, an M.S. in education from Indiana University, and an Indiana teacher's license. She taught science for seven years in Indiana classrooms. She and her husband, Thomas C. Arthur, a Presbyterian minister, raised four boys: William Howard, Thomas Joseph, James Stevenson and John David. She began working at the James Whitcomb Riley Home in 1981.
