Organizational History:

Toward the end of the 19th century and during the first two decades of the 20th, the Central Union Telephone Company had a service area which included Indianapolis and New Castle, Indiana. In Indianapolis, for many years, its service area overlapped that of a competing telephone company, the Indianapolis Telephone Company. In 1914, the Public Service Commission in Indianapolis tried to force a merger of the two companies to eliminate a duplication of services.

Scope and Content:

The collection consists of two letters of commendation for Miss Mary Folger. The letter of June 17, 1916, announces a raise for Miss Folger. The second letter, dated March 14, 1917, specifically commends Miss Folger to Mr. L.L. Monticue, Manager at New Castle, for "the splendid way [Miss Folger]...took hold and managed the situation" at New Castle.
