1. House, Thirteenth & Delaware Streets, built by the late  
Hervey Bates in 1873-74 at a cost of about \$100,000, later  
the Knights of Columbus Club House.
- 1a. Interior, Delaware & Thirteenth, Hervey Bates' house, hollywood  
and ebony panels.
2. House, 1320 N. Delaware Street, built by Dr. George Duzan,  
1871, later owned by Medford B. Wilson.
3. "Four Acres," Eleventh and Meridian Streets, built by  
William S. Hubbard in 1863 at a cost of \$30,000, later  
home of Mrs. William Scott and Mrs. Danial Stewart.

5. John N. Carey House, N. Meridian Street near Fourteenth,  
built by Capt. John M. Lord, 1873.
6. House, northwest corner Eleventh and Delaware, built by  
Stephen Keyes Fletcher, 1874.
7. House, owned by Mrs. Michael Clune, 1121 N. Pennsylvania  
Street, near Eleventh, built by Albert Elliot Fletcher,  
1873.

9. House, 2051 Hillside Avenue, built by Frederick Reschhaupt  
in 1873, twin belonged to Gustave Zschech.
10. Home of Mrs. Ovid B. Jameson, 1035 N. Pennsylvania Street,  
built by Bishop Edward Raymond Ames, probably oldest house  
in central part of Indianapolis, about 1854, altered by  
addition of porches, columns.
11. House, 1020 N. Pennsylvania Street, built by James Dickson,  
about 1867-1868.

12. Hugh Love house, 1804 North Meridian, built by Trustin Brown Boyd, 1878.
- 12a. Interior, spiral stairway in Trustin Boyd house, Eighteenth and Meridian Street.
- 12b. Interior, elaborate walnut mantelpiece in home of Trustin Boyd, 1878.

14. University Club, Meridian and 450 North, built by J.C. Ferguson, about 1868. "Beautiful stone carvings over windows."
15. House, northeast corner, Pennsylvania and Eleventh Streets, built by J.C. Ferguson for daughter, Mrs. Edward Howard.
16. Edwin L. Patrick home, 425 North Pennsylvania Street, built by J.C. Ferguson for daughter, Mrs. Nathan Neeld, 1872-3.
17. House bought by L.S. Ayres, 1882, Delaware Street at Twelfth Street, built by George Emory.
18. Glen Martin house, Meridian at southwest corner, St. Joseph, built by Col. G.W. Parker, 1873.
19. F.B. Brickly house, 1837 North Delaware, house was standing in 1870.

21. Schnull-Mueller (J. George) home, 1305 Central Avenue at Thirteenth Street, built by Henry Schnull.
22. I.O.O.F. Club House, 1336 North Delaware Street, rear built by Abram Springstern for Kauffman-occupied by Springstern, then sold to Charleton Eden, who added the front, 1878.
23. Merritt home, 324 N. West Street, built by George Merritt, about 1864.
24. House, 1217 North Delaware Street, built by Thomas Spann, 1873, bought by W.H.H. Miller, Attorney General in Benjamin Harrison's cabinet.
25. *House, Illinois Street at Pratt, built by Rev. David Stevenson in 1855*
26. William Coleman house, Meridian and Tenth Streets, built by Thompkins A. Lewis, 1867.
27. Sutphin residence, 1000 N. Delaware Street, built by Milton Cox, 1875-6.

28. House, 115 South Augubon Road, built by George Julian, 1873.
29. House, 29 South Audubon Road, built by Jacob Burnet Julian, 1871.
30. George L. Denny residence, 4456 Park Avenue, built by Oliver Johnson, about 1863.
31. House of Mrs. Horace McKay, Broadway near Fifteenth, 1886.
32. Tarkington House, 1100 North Pennsylvania, built by John S. Tarkington, 1868, D.H. Bohlin, architect. Booth Tarkington lived here as a child and adult.
33. House built by Mrs. Thomas Lupton, 1014 North Pennsylvania Street, 1867-8.

35. House, 962 North Pennsylvania Street, built by Jacob Cox, 1872.
36. Browning-Burford house, 1330 North Meridian Street, built by Robert Browning, 1872.

38. House, 436 East Ohio Street, built by Adolph Schellesmidt about time of Civil War.

41. House, 345 East Merrill Street, built in 1865 by Mr. and Mrs. Fred Augustus William Davis. (Mrs. Davis was Elizabeth Ketcham, daughter of John Ketcham, granddaughter of Samuel Merrill.
42. House, 501 S. New Jersey, built before 1860 by Joshua Stevens.
- 42a. House, 519-523 S. New Jersey, built before 1850 by Joshua Stevens.
43. House, 1526 South New Jersey, built about 1856 by Hervey Bates, Sr.; additions built by Hervey Bates, Jr.; additions built by Thomas A. Hendricks, 1865-1872, later owned by Mr. Thomas William Faust.
- 43a. Summer house built by Hervey Bates, Jr., 1526 S. New Jersey.

44. Home of Miss Anne Wright, 4150 Central Avenue, built by Resin Hammond, 1848.
45. House. 509 S. New Jersey, built by William Drinkut late in 1870's. He married Florence Coffman, granddaughter of Joshua Stevens.
46. House, 509 South Noble Street, "built 70 years ago by Drinkut family."
47. Clippinger Cottage, 1028 North Delaware Street, built by George Clippinger, 1877 or 1879.
