Since 2011, the Indiana State Library, in partnership with Net Literacy, has made over 1,200 free, rebuilt computers and monitors available to public and institutional libraries in Indiana.

WTTV, a CBS affiliate in Indianapolis, recently ran a segment on the Indiana Voices program at the Indiana State library. Thanks to a host of volunteers, one full time staff member, and a grant from the Ruth Lilly Philanthropic Foundation, the program is able to record books of Indiana interest that are otherwise not available in an accessible format for patrons of the **Indiana Talking** Book and Braille Library to enjoy.
