A “Passport in time” has been issued to you to come and join us for a day of learning about Indiana’s Historic Shipwrecks on Tuesday, July 19. Come and learn about Indiana’s history and the sailors who braved the rough waters of Lake Michigan in the pioneer years of the state’s development. Your travel itinerary is listed below. Shipwrecks, like the wreck of the *Muskegon* (also known as the *Peerless*), which happened 100 years ago this fall, are memorials to Indiana’s maritime history. With funding from NOAA, Indiana’s Lake Michigan Coastal Management Program is coordinating archaeological investigations of shipwrecks in the Indiana waters of Lake Michigan.
