

## Boonville municipal water rate case: Consumer comments invited

If you would like to comment on the City of Boonville's proposed water rate increase, here's your opportunity.

The Indiana Office of Utility Consumer Counselor (OUCC), the state agency representing consumer interests in cases before the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission (IURC), is reviewing the city's request and is scheduled to file testimony on July 25, 2018.

Along with its legal and technical review, the OUCC is inviting written consumer comments through July 18, 2018.

Current rates for Boonville's municipal water utility received IURC approval in 2009. The city is proposing a twophase increase that would raise the monthly residential water rate for 5,000 gallons as follows (figures include fire protection charges):

	Current	Phase 1 Increase	Phase 2 Increase
In City	\$34.14	\$54.45	\$57.18
Out of City	\$34.14	\$67.51	\$70.90

The utility is also seeking IURC approval to issue up to \$6.9 million in long-term debt. According to its testimony, Boonville is seeking the rate increase and financing authorization due to higher operating and maintenance costs along with the need to make capital improvements. Proposed capital improvement projects include storage tank rehabilitation, main replacements and extensions, a new well, a new booster station, new meters with new metering technology, and installation of solar energy facilities at its treatment plant and wellfield.

The OUCC needs to receive all written consumer comments on or before July 18, 2018 so that it can: 1) Consider them in preparing its testimony and 2) File them with the Commission to be included in the case's formal evidentiary record.

Comments should include the consumer's **name**, **mailing address**, and a reference to "**IURC Cause No. 45069**." To protect your privacy, please do not include your account number. Only Boonville's water rates are at issue in this case. State law does not authorize the IURC to approve municipal sewer utility rates, which are set by elected city and town councils.

An IURC evidentiary hearing will be held on September 18, 2018 at the PNC Center (101 W. Washington St.) in Indianapolis. While evidentiary hearings are open to the public, participation is typically limited to attorney and Commission questioning of technical witnesses. A final decision in the case is expected either later this year or in January 2019.
