## **Rivers Edge water rate case: Consumer comments invited**

If you would like to comment on the water rate increase proposed by Wastewater One, doing business as Rivers Edge Utility, Inc., you have the chance to do so.

The Indiana Office of Utility Consumer Counselor (OUCC) is inviting written consumer comments on the request through February 14, 2017. The OUCC, the state agency representing consumer interests in cases before the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission (IURC), is scheduled to file its report in this case on February 21, 2017.

Current water rates for Rivers Edge – which provides service in Clark County – were approved in 2010. Under the utility's pending request, the monthly water bill for a residential customer using 5,000 gallons would rise from \$39.85 to \$67.15. The utility cites higher operating and maintenance costs in its filing with the IURC, along with multiple capital improvements including new tanks and the replacements of well pumps, valves, and pipes.

The OUCC needs to receive all written consumer comments no later than February 14, 2017 so that it can: 1) Consider them in preparing its report and 2) File them with the Commission to be included in the case's formal evidentiary record.

Comments should include the consumer's **name**, **mailing address**, and a reference to "**IURC Cause No. 44876-U**." Consumers with questions about submitting written comments can contact the OUCC's consumer services staff toll-free at 1-888-441-2494.

Rivers Edge is seeking the water rate increase through the state's Small Utility Filing Procedure, which is available to utilities with fewer than 5,000 customers and is designed to reduce the time and expense involved with regulatory filings. Savings are gained by allowing utility staff to use standardized forms and the utility's resulting need for less assistance from rate consultants or attorneys.

The standard for OUCC and IURC reviews on small utility filings is the same that applies to traditional utility filings. The OUCC conducts its review on behalf of all utility consumers while the IURC's review is conducted on behalf of the public interest (a balancing of utility and customer interests). A settlement agreement is possible in any legal proceeding; such an agreement, if reached, would require IURC approval.
