TO: THE OFFICIALS OF THE AMITY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT, JOHNSON COUNTY, INDIANA

We have examined the financial information presented herein of the Amity Fire Protection District (District), for the period of January 1, 2006 to December 31, 2007. The District's management is responsible for the financial information presented herein. Our responsibility is to express an opinion based on our examination.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL INFORMATION

Note 1. Introduction

The Amity Fire Protection District (District) was established under the laws of the State of Indiana. The District provides the following services: fire protection to portions of Blue River, Franklin, and Needham Townships in Johnson County, Indiana.

Note 2. Fund Accounting

The District uses funds to report on its cash and investments and the results of its operations on a cash basis. Fund accounting is designed to demonstrate legal compliance and to aid financial management by segregating transactions related to certain governmental functions or activities.

Note 3. Budgets

The operating budget is initially prepared and approved at the local level. In addition, funds for which property taxes are levied are subject to final approval by the Indiana Department of Local Government Finance.

Note 4. Property Taxes

Property taxes levied are collected by the County Treasurer and are distributed to the District in June and December. State statute (IC 6-1.1-17-16) requires the Indiana Department of Local Government Finance to establish property tax rates and levies by February 15. These rates were based upon the preceding year's March 1 (lien date) assessed valuations adjusted for various tax credits. Taxable property is assessed at 100% of the true tax value (determined in accordance with rules and regulations adopted by the Indiana Department of Local Government Finance). Taxes may be paid in two equal installments which become delinquent if not paid by May 10 and November 10, respectively. All property taxes collected by the County Treasurer and available for distribution were distributed to the District on or prior to December 31 of the year collected.

Note 5. Deposits and Investments

Deposits, made in accordance with Indiana Code 5-13, with financial institutions in the State of Indiana at year end were entirely insured by the Federal Depository Insurance Corporation or by the Indiana Public Deposit Insurance Fund. This includes any deposit accounts issued or offered by a qualifying financial institution.

State statute (IC 5-13-9) authorizes the District to invest in securities including, but not limited to, federal government securities, repurchase agreements, and certain money market mutual funds. Certain other statutory restrictions apply to all investments made by local governmental units.

Note 6. Subsequent Event

Flooding during June 2008 caused undetermined damages to the Amity Fire Station. Resulting mold has left the future utilization of the facility in question.

CAPITAL ASSETS

Information presented for examination did not indicate an inventory or record of capital assets using Form 369.

Officials and employees are required to use State Board of Accounts prescribed or approved forms in the manner prescribed. (Accounting and Uniform Compliance Guidelines Manual for Special Districts, Chapter 10)

OPTICAL IMAGES OF WARRANTS

The District's financial institution did not return the original cancelled checks with the monthly bank statements. The financial institution provided optical imaging of the front of the original issued checks. No optical image was provided of the back of the original issued check. As a result, information pertaining to check endorsements and other banking information was not available for the examination period.

Indiana Code 5-15-6-3(a) concerning optical imaging of checks, states in part:

". . . 'original records' includes the optical image of a check or deposit document when:

- (1) the check or deposit document is recorded, copied, or reproduced by an optical imaging process . . . and
- (2) the drawer of the check receives an optical image of the check after the check is processed for payment . . ."

Further, Indiana Code 26-2-8-111 states in part:

"(a) If a law requires that certain records be retained, that requirement is met by retaining an electronic record of the information in the record that:

- (1) accurately reflects the information set forth in the record after it was first generated in its final form as an electronic record or otherwise; and
- (2) remains accessible for later reference."

"(e) If a law requires retention of a check, that requirement is satisfied by retention of an electronic record of the information on the front and back of the check in accordance with subsection (a)."
