FEES - POLICE

Ordinance No. 1992-2 established a fee of \$3 for a copy of an accident report. However, the City collected \$5 for each accident report requested. Also, no fees were collected for Vehicle Title Inspections even though Ordinance No. 1992-6 established a fee of \$5 for each Vehicle Title Inspection performed.

RECORD OF HOURS WORKED

Except for police officers who started reporting time worked in 2014, no records of hours worked were maintained for any salaried employees during the examination period.

The federal Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) requires that records of wages paid, daily and weekly hours of work, and the time of day and day of week on which the employee's work week begins be kept for all employees. These requirements can be met by use of the following prescribed general forms:

General Form 99A, Employees' Service Record General Form 99B, Employee's Earnings Record General Form 99C, Employee's Weekly Earnings Record

General Form 99C is required only for employees who are not exempt from FLSA, are not on a fixed work schedule, and are not paid weekly.
