RE: Amended Governing Body Selection Plan: Metropolitan School District of North Posey

North Posey has submitted the attached materials to amend its governing body selection plan. The materials include a certification from the Posey County Clerk indicating no protests or counter-petitions have been filed, as well as a publisher's affidavit indicating satisfaction of the publishing requirements of I.C. 20-23-8-14.

The plan as submitted satisfies the requirements on I.C. 20-23-8 and is recommended for approval by the Board pursuant to I.C. 20-23-8-15.

(School Board Member Districts)




Diagram of North Posey Metropolitan School District showing School Board Member Districts as Established by the County Commissioners.

It is considered that the ratio of votes cast to population in the various precincts is fairly constant. It would be impossible to equalize the population in the various districts without dividing one or more voting precincts. The disadvantages which would arise from such a move would more than offset the disadvantage of having unequal numbers of people in the various districts.

School Board Member District	Make-up by Voting Precincts
No. 1	Bethel, Robb 2, Robb 3, Smith W, Smith E.
No. 2	Robb 1, Center N., Robinson 3
No. 3	Center S., Robinson 1, Robinson 2

All voters in the entire school district may vote on school board candidates. The candidates who receive the highest number of votes shall be elected for 4-year terms. The Board shall consist of 5 members with at least one but not more than two - from each of the three school board members districts. In the case of vacancies which occur on the Board, the remaining members of the board shall by a majority vote fill such vacancy by appointing a person from the same district from which the person who vacated the board membership was elected.

The following table is the identification and make-up of the school board member districts together with the Posey County Federal census released in October, 1981.

Section 18 of Chapter 226 of the 1949 Acts of the Indiana General Assembly provides that a metropolitan school board shall be elected in the first primary election following creation of any metropolitan school district. Procedure for becoming a school board member candidate thereafter is as follows:

1. Nomination shall be made by petition signed by the nominee and ten voters residing in the same school board member district as the nominee.
2. Such petition shall be filed with the clerk of the circuit court in the respective county, at the proper time, as required by law for filing primary candidacy.
3. Such nomination shall be listed on a separate ballot without party designation.

All voters in the entire school district may vote on school board candidates. The candidates who receive the highest number of votes shall be elected for 4-year terms. The Board shall consist of 5 members with at least one but not more than two - from each of the three school board members districts. In the case of vacancies which occur on the Board, the remaining members of the board shall by a majority vote fill such vacancy by appointing a person from the same district from which the person who vacated the board membership was elected.

The organizational meeting of the Board shall be within five (5) days after the first of July each year or at any other time when the personnel of the Board is changed. One member shall be elected president, one vice president, and one secretary. The Board shall appoint a Board treasurer who is neither a member of the Board nor the Superintendent of Schools.

RESOLUTION OF M.S.D. OF NORTH POSEY COUNTY

PLAN OF CONSTITUTION – GOVERNING BODY SELECTION CHANGE

PURSUANT TO IC 20-23-8

RESOLUTION NO. 2014-01-13-01

WHEREAS, M.S.D. of North Posey County (“North Posey”) was organized in 1957 and has always been governed by an elected school board.

WHEREAS, North Posey at inception consisted of Smith, Robb, Bethel, Center, and Robinson Townships in Posey County, Indiana, and those townships were divided into three (3) residence districts for purposes of electing a five (5) member school board, with a member from each residence district but no more than two (2) members from one (1) residence district.

WHEREAS, North Posey and Consolidated School Town of New Harmony & Harmony Township (“New Harmony”) adopted a Joint Resolution on January 19, 2012 whereby North Posey annexed New Harmony pursuant to IC 20-23-5 and the annexation was effective July 1, 2012.

WHEREAS, North Posey now consists of Smith, Robb, Bethel, Center, Robinson, and Harmony Townships in Posey County, Indiana.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the temporary plan of constitution approved by the State Board of Education upon annexation of New Harmony, North Posey was allowed time to consider and propose a fair and equitable plan of constitution for the election of all five (5) board members in November, 2014, and for elections thereafter.

WHEREAS, North Posey has held open meetings discussing a plan of constitution, solicited public input, and published in the local newspaper articles describing this proposed plan of constitution that North Posey believes promotes fair and equitable representation, clearly describes and identifies residence districts, and simplifies election ballots.

WHEREAS, North Posey has two (2) elementary schools, one (1) junior high school, and one (1) senior high school, and a plan to divide North Posey into two (2) residence districts generally based upon the boundary line of the two (2) elementary schools districts is fair and equitable based upon population and student enrollment.

THEREFORE, the board of school trustees of North Posey **RESOLVES** as follows:

RESOLVED, that pursuant to IC 20-23-4-27 (c)(2), North Posey board of school trustees shall consist of five (5) elected members elected to four (4) year terms. North Posey shall be divided into two (2) residence districts with two (2) members of the board of trustees residents within Residence District 1 and two (2) members of the board of trustees residents within Residence District 2 as described below. One (1) member of the board of trustees shall be elected at-large and may reside in Residence District 1 or Residence District 2. All candidates must be voted on by all registered voters of North Posey (Residence District 1 and Residence District 2) voting at any board of school trustees election. Board of school trustees shall be elected at general elections when county officials are elected.

When the at-large seat stands for election, North Posey registered voters may vote for two (2) candidates in a residence district and one (1) candidate in the other residence district. Elections when the at-large seat does not stand for election, North Posey registered voters may vote for one (1) candidate from each residence district.

RESOLVED, that Residence District 1 shall consist of the political townships of Smith, Robb, Bethel, and Harmony Townships, and that part of Center Township described below:

1. **North and East of the following described line:**

Beginning at the Harmony and Center Townships boundary line intersection with the center line of Hidbrader Road, thence East and continuing along the center line of Hidbrader Road to its intersection with Stallings Road center line, thence South along the center line of Stallings Road to its intersection with Hidbrader Road center line, thence East and continuing along the center line of Hidbrader Road until the center line of Hidbrader Road turns North.

2. **West of the following described line:**

Continuing North along the center line of Hidbrader Road until the center line of Hidbrader Road turns East.

3. **North of the following described line:**

Continuing East along the center line of Hidbrader Road to its intersection with Springfield Road center line, thence from the center line of Springfield Road continuing due East to the center line of the former Louisville and Nashville Railroad Company (L & N) right-of-way as described in a Quit Claim Deed recorded at Deed Book 95, Page 202, in the office of the Posey County Recorder.

4. **West of the following described line:**

Continuing from the center line of the L & N Railroad Company right-of-way North to its intersection with Main Street, Wadesville, Center Township, and thence continuing 165 feet along the center line of the railroad.

5. **East of the following described line:**

Continuing in a Southeasterly direction 165 feet from and parallel to the center line of Main Street, Wadesville, to the intersection of the center line of Joest Road.

6. **North and West of the following described line:**

Continuing East along the center line of Joest Road to its intersection with Blake Road center line.

7. **North of the following described line:**

Continuing East along the center line of Blake Road to its intersection with Center and Robinson Townships boundary line (Big Creek).

RESOLVED, that Residence District 2 shall consist of Robinson Township and the remaining part of Center Township not included in Residence District 1.

RESOLVED, that Center Township is the only township that is split.

RESOLVED as to the November 2014 election only, all registered voters of North Posey may vote for five (5) candidates: three (3) candidates from one residence district and two (2) candidates from the other residence district.

November 2014 election vote totals shall seat candidates as follows:

A. The candidate from Residence District 1 with the most votes and the candidate from Residence District 2 with the most votes shall have the option to be seated to a two (2) year or four (4) year term in their residence district. The candidates must exercise their option to select a two (2) or four (4) year term by filing a written designation with the Posey County Clerk prior to January 1, 2015. Failure to timely file the designation will result in the candidate or candidates being seated to the four (4) year term.

B. The candidate from Residence District 1 with the second most votes and the candidate from Residence District 2 with the second most votes shall be seated to the other term in their residence district.

C. The remaining candidate with the most votes from either Residence District 1 or Residence District 2 shall be seated to a two (2) year term as the at-large member.


RESOLVED, that this plan of constitution shall be effective upon certification of the plan by the State Board of Education, but no later than July 1, 2014.

RESOLVED, that this resolution and plan of constitution shall be construed to comply with IC 20-23-8-(1-25), and if a provision of this plan violates any part of the Indiana Code, the invalidity does not affect the other provisions or applications of this plan that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application. The provisions of this plan are severable, specifically as set forth in IC 20-23-8-8(b).







**Minutes – Regular Meeting of the

January 13, 2014

A meeting of the Board of Education of the MSD of North Posey County, Poseyville, Indiana, was held in the Board office of MSD of North Posey County on January 13, 2014. The following Board members were present:

Executive Session

The Board convened the Executive Session at 5:30 p.m. for the purpose of IC 5-14- 1.5-6.1 (9) to discuss job performance and evaluation of individual employees. The Board adjourned Executive Session at 6:32 p.m.

Regular Meeting

The Board of Education convened for the regular meeting at 6:35 p.m. with acting Board President, Steve Bender, calling the meeting to order with the initiation of the Pledge of Allegiance. Minutes of the previous meeting were presented to the Board for December 9, 2013. Upon a motion made by Mr. Scarafia and seconded by Mr. Neidig, the minutes were approved with a 5 to 0 vote.

Claim Docket

A copy of the claim docket for the period of December 9, 2013 to January 13, 2014 was presented to the Board for consideration. Upon a motion made by Mr. Neidig, seconded by Mrs. O’Risky, the claim docket was approved with a 5 to 0 vote. A copy of the approved claim docket shall be made a part of the official minutes by incorporation.

New Business

Dr. Camp turned the meeting over to acting school board attorney, Bill Bender, to reorganize the School Board and lead the elections.

Bill Bender opened the floor for nominations for the office of President of the School Board. Mr. Neidig nominated Stephen Bender for president, Mrs. O'Risky made a motion to close the nominations. Bill Bender called for a vote. Mr. Bender was elected with a 5 to 0 vote.

Bill Bender opened the floor for nominations for the office of Vice President of the School Board. Mr. Bender nominated Joseph Neidig for Vice President, Mr. Scarafia made a motion to close the nominations. Bill Bender called for a vote. Mr. Neidig was elected with a 5 to 0 vote.

Bill Bender opened the floor for nominations for the office of Secretary of the School Board. Mr. Gentil nominated Linda O'Risky for Secretary, Mr. Neidig made a motion to close the nominations. Bill Bender called for a vote. Mrs. O'Risky was elected with a 5 to 0 vote.

Bill Bender asked the members to appoint a treasurer for the corporation. Mr. Bender made a motion to appoint Carol Lupfer as Corporation Treasurer, and Mr. Neidig seconded the appointment. The appointment carried 5 to 0.

Bill Bender asked the members appoint a deputy treasurer for the corporation. Mr. Scarafia made a motion to appoint Jayme Bender as the corporation's Deputy Treasurer and Mr. Neidig seconded the appointment. The appointment carried 5 to 0.

Bill Bender turned the meeting over to Steve Bender, the newly elected president.

Mr. Bender asked the Board to appoint a School Board Attorney. Mr. Gentil made a motion to appoint William Bender as the school Board Attorney, and Mr. Scarafia seconded the motion. The appointment carried 5 to 0.

Mr. Bender asked the Board to nominate members to the Board of Finance. Mr. Neidig made a motion to appoint Geoffrey Gentil as President of the Board of Finance and James Scarafia as Treasurer of the Board of Finance, and Mrs. O'Risky seconded the motion. The motion carried 5 to 0.

Mr. Bender asked the Board to appoint a Policy Liaison and Legislative Liaison for the Board. Mr. Scarafia made a motion to appoint Mr. Gentil as Policy Liaison and Mr. Neidig as Legislative Liaison, and Mrs. O'Risky seconded the motion. The appointment carried 5 to 0.

Dr. Camp informed the Board that they should examine compensation wages for the 2014 Board. Mrs. O'Risky made a motion that the Board continue their current compensation package. Mr. Gentil seconded the motion, and the motion carried 5 to 0. The Board will receive a \$2,000.00 annual stipend and \$100.00 per meeting for twelve (12) meetings for a maximum salary of \$3,200.00 per member for a calendar year's service.

Dr. Camp passed out Conflict of Interest statements to Stephen Bender, Geoffrey Gentil, Joseph Neidig, and Linda O'Risky to sign. No action from the Board was needed.

Dr. Camp and William Bender, School Board Attorney, requested permission to pass the Resolution of MSD of North Posey County Plan of Constitution and advertise the resolution. The resolution was discussed thoroughly in the October and November meetings and details the revisions proposed for Board district alignment. Upon a motion made by Mr. Gentil and seconded by Mrs. O'Risky, the request was approved with a 5 to 0 vote.

Dr. Camp asked the Board to review his contract and add a provision in the insurance section that would indicate he would qualify for the HSA contributions that all other employees receive if they take a High Deductible Plan. The Board allowed for comment on this adjustment to the contract due to the insurance change. No comments were presented. Mr. Gentil made a motion to approve the request and Mrs. O'Risky seconded the motion. The motion carried 5 to 0.

Dr. Camp presented the Board with the A-F Accountability Grades. The final report is that ALL schools in the corporation received A's for their grade, as well as, the corporation received an A. We were one of 27 public school districts in Indiana to receive this honor. It is the second time in three years we have accomplished this high standard. Dr. Wannemuehler discussed details for each school. No action necessary.

Dr. Camp asked the Board to approve the PL221 plans and Professional Development plans as presented. They have been reviewed by the committee and the exclusive representative. Mr. Scarafia made a motion to approve the request and Mr. Neidig seconded the motion. The motion carried 5 to 0.

Dr. Camp asked the Board to approve the PLTW agreement as presented. Mrs. O'Risky made a motion to approve the request and Mr. Gentil seconded the motion. The motion carried 5 to 0.

Dr. Camp presented a request from Marilyn Rogers to take the Physics, Calculus, and AP English classes to Chicago for their annual trip. The trip is scheduled for March 1 – March 4. On the agenda for the trip are visits to the Shedd Aquarium, the Field Museum, the Adler Planetarium, the Fermi Lab, the Hancock Tower, the Art Institute of Chicago, and the Museum of Science and Industry. Depending on the number of students that attend, two chaperones may be necessary (one male and one female). Mr. Gentil made a motion to approve the request and Mr. Scarafia seconded the motion. The motion carried 5 to 0.

Dr. Camp presented a request from Mike Wassmer to take approximately 53 North Posey High School FFA students to the Louisville National Farm Machinery Show on February 12, 2014. This is a reward trip for those members of the FFA who sold the required quota of fruit. Mrs. O'Risky made a motion to approve the request and Mr. Gentil seconded the motion. The motion carried 5 to 0.

Dr. Camp presented facility use requests from Wadesville Blairsville Regional Sewer District to use the library of South Terrace for their 2014 monthly board meetings. The District's Board meets the third Tuesday of each month at 7:00 pm as listed on their request forms. Mr. Neidig made a motion to approve the requests and Mr. Scarafia seconded the motion. The motion carried 5 to 0.

Dr. Camp asked the Board to approve the agreement with American Appraisal for the fixed assets accountability that is required by law. We also use the information for insurance purposes. The cost is \$1,120.00. Mr. Gentil made a motion to approve the request and Mr. Scarafia seconded the motion. The motion carried 5 to 0.

Dr. Camp presented a request from Debra Whitfield, teacher North Posey High School, to attend the WorldStrides International Teacher Convention in Florence, Italy on February 13 - 17, 2014. Mrs. Whitfield feels this is a once in a lifetime opportunity and plans to use her leave days for the trip. Mrs. O'Risky made a motion to approve the request and Mr. Scarafia seconded the motion. The motion carried 5 to 0.

Hiring

Dr. Camp requested the Board approve his request to hire Frank Smith as the district's School Resource Officer effective January 2, 2014. Mr. Gentil made a motion to approve the request and Mr. Neidig seconded the motion. The motion carried 5 to 0.

Dr. Camp presented a request from Terri Waugaman to hire Courtney Wolf as an instructional assistant for the Title I program at North Elementary effective January 2, 2014 for the remainder of the 2013-2014 school year. Mrs. O'Risky made a motion to approve the request and Mr. Neidig seconded the motion. The motion carried 5 to 0.

Dr. Camp presented a request to transfer Jenny Wiggins from technology coordinator position at North Elementary to technology teacher effective January 2, 2014. This teacher will create the curriculum and work with both elementary school students with their keyboarding and technology skills. She will build the program this semester and begin the full curriculum in the 2014-15 school year. Mr. Neidig made a motion to approve the request and Mr. Scarafia seconded the motion. The motion carried 5 to 0.

Dr. Camp presented a request from Terri Waugaman to hire Rochelle Belt and Susan Cooper as instructional assistants for the Title I program at North Elementary effective January 20, 2014 for the remainder of the 2013-2014 school year. Mrs. O'Risky made a motion to approve the requests and Mr. Gentil seconded the motion. The motion carried 5 to 0.

Dr. Camp presented a request from Bradley Miller to add Joe Schmitt as a Junior High volunteer wrestling coach. Mr. Neidig made a motion to approve the request and Mrs. O'Risky seconded the motion. The motion carried 5 to 0.

Dr. Camp presented a request from Kelly Trafton to have Weston Whitehouse as a volunteer assistant director for the spring production at North Posey High School. Mrs. O'Risky made a motion to approve the request and Mr. Scarafia seconded the motion. The motion carried 5 to 0.

Pursuant to IC 20-23-8-14 voters have the right to file a petition for alternative plans or a petition protesting the adoption of the plan set forth below. IC 20-23-8-14(d) states not later than one hundred twenty (120) days after the publication of this notice, voters of the school corporation may file with the Posey County Clerk a petition protesting a plan initiated or approved by the governing body or a petition submitting an alternative plan as follows:

1. A petition protesting a plan shall be signed by at least twenty percent (20%) of the voters of the school corporation or five hundred (500) voters of the school corporation, whichever is less.
2. A petition submitting an alternative plan shall be signed by at least twenty percent (20%) of the voters of the school corporation.

A petition filed under this subsection shall be certified by the clerk and shall be filed with the governing body in the same manner as is provided for a petition in section 11 of this chapter.

WHEREAS, M.S.D. of North Posey County ("North Posey") was organized in 1957 and has always been governed by an elected school board.
WHEREAS, North Posey at inception consisted of Smith, Robb, Bethel, Center, and Robinson Townships in Posey County, Indiana, and those townships were divided into three (3) residence districts for purposes of electing a five (5) member school board, with a member from each residence district but no more than two (2) members from one (1) residence district.
WHEREAS, North Posey and Consolidated School Town of New Harmony & Harmony Township (New Harmony) adopted a Joint Resolution on January 19, 2012 whereby North Posey annexed New Harmony pursuant to IC 20-23-5 and the annexation was effective July 1, 2012.
WHEREAS, North Posey now consists of Smith, Robb, Bethel, Center, Robinson, and Harmony Townships in Posey County, Indiana.
WHEREAS, pursuant to the temporary plan of constitution approved by the State Board of Education upon annexation of New Harmony, North Posey was allowed time to consider and propose a fair and equitable plan of constitution for the election of all five (5) board members in November, 2014, and for elections thereafter.
WHEREAS, North Posey has held open meetings discussing a plan of constitution, solicited public input, and published in the local newspaper articles describing this proposed plan of constitution that North Posey believes promotes fair and equitable representation, clearly describes and identifies residence districts, and simplifies election ballots.
WHEREAS, North Posey has two (2) elementary schools, one (1) junior high school, and one (1) senior high school, and a plan to divide North Posey into two (2) residence districts generally based upon the boundary line of the two (2) elementary schools districts is fair and equitable based upon population and student enrollment.
THEREFORE, the board of school trustees of North Posey **RESOLVES** as follows:
RESOLVED, that pursuant to IC 20-23-4-27 (c)(2), North Posey board of school trustees shall consist of five (5) elected members elected to four (4) year terms. North Posey shall be divided into two (2) residence districts with two (2) members of the board of trustees residents within Residence District 1 and two (2) members of the board of trustees residents within Residence District 2 as described below. 
