Perry Township Schools has submitted the attached materials to amend its governing body selection plan. The materials include a certification from the Marion County Clerk indicating no protests or counter-petitions have been filed, as well as a publisher's affidavit indicating satisfaction of the publishing requirements of I.C. 20-23-8-14.

The plan as submitted satisfies the requirements on I.C. 20-23-8 and is recommended for approval by the Board pursuant to I.C. 20-23-8-15.

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RESOLVED, by the Board of Education ("Board") of The Metropolitan School District of Perry Township, Marion County, Indiana ("School Corporation") that the manner in which the Board is constituted shall be changed under I.C. 20-23-8-10 so that it is constituted in accordance with the following plan ("Plan"):

1. Name. The governing body of the School Corporation shall be called the Board of Education as it presently is. Pursuant to a resolution adopted by the Board on October 7, 2013, the name of the School Corporation will change to Perry Township Schools effective January 1, 2014.
2. Members to be Elected.- Number, Term and Qualification. The Board shall consist of seven (7) members who shall be elected at the general election in even-numbered years ("general election"), in accordance with I.C. 20-23-4-29.1 by all the registered voters voting at each applicable school board election in the School Corporation. Each member shall serve for a term of four years and may succeed himself or herself in office. Each member of the Board shall, as of the time of his or her election, be registered and entitled to vote for members of the Board of the School Corporation, have lived in the School Corporation for one year and be not be less than eighteen (18) years of age.
3. Manner of Election. The School Corporation shall not be divided into residence districts but, instead, all members shall serve on an at-large basis and may

reside anywhere within the boundaries of the School Corporation. The time of election shall be staggered so that four (4) members will be elected at one general election and three (3) at the next succeeding general election.

4. Time Plan Effective. The Plan shall be effective at the following times:

(1) at the time the State Board of Education certifies the Plan under I.C. 20-23-8-15 if no special election is required to be held under I.C. 20-23-8-16; or

(2) immediately following any special election held, or if none is then held, at the time provided in I.C. 20-23-8-19.

5. Transition Provisions. The Board at the time this Plan is adopted is elected at alternate general elections and consists of seven members. Three members have terms that expire on December 31, 2014 and all of them reside in the present School Corporation boundaries. Four members have terms that expire on December 31, 2016. Three of the four members whose terms expire in 2016 reside in the School Corporation boundaries and the fourth member resides in the area within the boundaries of the Indianapolis Public Schools from which the School Corporation receives students under the federal court desegregation order that will essentially phase out at the end of the 2016 school year). All seven members will serve through their present terms. Three members will be elected under this plan of organization at the 2014 general election and four members will be elected under this plan of reorganization in the 2016 general election. Therefore, starting with the general election in 2016, no member will be

elected from outside the School Corporation boundaries and this plan will be in full effect at that time.



ITEMS OF INFORMATION REQUIRING ACTION

Mr. Willey recommended approval of the AT&T contract for service at the James Whitcomb Riley building. Mr. Mertz moved to approve, Ms. Freeman seconded. The motion carried 7/0.

Mrs. Carpenter recommended approval to accept a donation of \$126 from Kroger at Bluff & Southport Roads to Glenns Valley Elementary. Mr. Mertz made a motion to approve, Mr. Morris seconded. The motion passed 7/0.

Mr. Bohannon recommended approval to accept a donation of \$150 from the Greater Southport Business alliance to the Southport High School Honor Society. Ms. Freeman moved to approve, Ms. Alexander seconded. The motion passed 7/0.

Mr. Bohannon recommended acceptance of \$5,000 from Kroger for professional development/training for teachers. Mr. Mercer moved to approve, Mr. Mertz seconded. The motion passed 7/0. Mr. John Elliott from Kroger Corporation presented the district with a \$5,000 check. Mr. Elliott stated from what he observed in awards and student recognitions tonight, this is an investment in our neighborhood schools and kids. These students and kids are our future and define our work force.

Dr. Giles recommended approval of the proposal from GSO addressing the RFP for enrollment growth and facility utilization. Ms. Freeman made a motion to approve, Mr. Morris seconded. The motion passed 7/0.

Dr. Little recommended approval of the revised resolution for the plan of organization for the Board of Education. Mr. Mertz made a motion to approve, Ms. Alexander seconded. The motion carried 7/0.

ITEMS OF INFORMATION NOT REQUIRING ACTION

Mr. Bagley and Mrs. Jones-Jointer reviewed the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act:

An Employer is not required to provide health insurance coverage, but an employer such as Perry Township Schools will face tax penalties beginning in January, 2016 if it:

Fails to provide minimum essential coverage to at least 95% of its full-time employees (30 hours week/130 hours month) or if the coverage is not affordable (9.5% of household income).

Penalty #1: When minimum essential coverage is not offered to at least 95% of full-time employees, a penalty of \$2,000 per employee is assessed to the employer. This penalty would be approximately \$3.8 million for Perry Township Schools.

Penalty #2: Applies if the employer does not provide minimum value health insurance or the coverage is not affordable. This affects full-time employees that are not offered insurance (the other 5%). The penalty is \$3,000 per for each full-time employee that qualifies for a Federal Subsidy on an exchange.

Decisions to be made in the near future:

- > Offer Health Insurance to all or part of these employee groups during the November, 2014 open enrollment period,
- > Reduce work hours to below the 30 hour per week threshold for all or part of these employee groups for the 2014/2015 school year;

Regulatory Guidelines:

It is important to note that the current Regulatory Guidelines are only proposed. Approved Regulatory Guidelines will be issued later this year. The guidelines could change as they have during the past 12 months.

Mrs. Jones-Jointer reviewed the flexible spending account carry-over.

Dr. Little conducted the first reading of Board Policies 7000: Property, and 3213: Student Supervision & Welfare and 4213: Student Well-Being.

Dr. Giles conducted a referendum facilities update.

COMMENTS AND CONCERNS OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION AND SUPERINTENDENT

Mrs. Alexander had no comment.

Mr. Maple stated anyone who is interested in Early Childhood Education, Inside Indiana held a panel session with one of our esteemed former graduates, Ted Maple. RESOLUTION

REORGANIZATION PLAN

OF

BOARD OF EDUCATION

METROPOLITAN SCHOOL DISTRICT OF PERRY TOWNSHIP

MARION COUNTY, INDIANA

WHEREAS, Public Law 315 of the Acts of the Indiana General Assembly of 1971, as amended (I.C. 20-4-10.1-1 through 20-4-10.1-19 inclusive) invests the Board of Education with the power to change the present Plan of Organization; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Metropolitan School District of Perry Township, Marion County, Indiana (MSDPT) has reviewed the Plan of School Board Reorganization and has determined and found that it is in the best interests of MSDPT that the present Plan be changed; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of MSDPT does hereby change its Plan of School Board Organization, and declare and resolve that the Plan set forth herein shall be the Plan for School Board Organization and for the Board of Education of MSDPT.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Board of Education of MSDPT, Marion County, Indiana, does hereby adopt the Plan of School Board Organization relating to this section, term of office, qualification and related details for members of its governing body, Board of Education, in accordance with the provisions and procedures set forth in Public Law 315 of the Acts of the Indiana General Assembly of 1971, as amended, which Plan shall be as follows:

I. General:

- (A) This Plan is prepared and presented pursuant to the provisions of I.C. 20-4-10.1-1 through 20-4-10.1-19 inclusive.
- (B) All provisions, conditions and definitions of those Code section are hereby adopted as part of this Plan.

II. Definitions:

- (A) As used in this Reorganization Plan, the following terms and words shall have the following meanings:
 - 1. "Original Plan" shall refer to the current organization of this corporation;
 - 2. "School District" shall mean Metropolitan School District of Perry Township, Marion County, Indiana, including the extended district established in the United States District Court, Southern District of Indiana, Indianapolis Division under Case No. IP68-3-225;
 - 3. "Voter" shall mean any person who is registered and eligible to vote at a primary election for a School Board member of the Metropolitan School District of Perry Township in any voting precinct comprising the school district;
 - 4. When the word "he" is used, it shall be considered as a word of description only, and shall include both masculine and feminine;
 - 5. "School Board" shall mean the Board of Education, Metropolitan School District of Perry Township, Marion County, Indiana;
 - 6. "Time of Election and/or Election" shall mean the primary election held in May of even-numbered years.

III. District:

- (A) The School District shall consist of the present boundaries of the Metropolitan School District of Perry Township, including the extended areas established in the United States District Court, Southern District of Indiana, Indianapolis Division under Case No. IP68-3-225.
- (B) The governing body of the school corporation shall be called the Board of Education as it presently is.

IV. Members to Be Elected - Number, Term and Qualification:

- (A) The Board of Education shall consist of seven (7) members, who

shall be elected at the primary election at which county officials are nominated ("primary election") from resident districts described below, in accordance with provisions of I.C. 20-4-1-26.2 by all registered and eligible voters voting in each applicable School Board election in the school corporation.

- (B) As of the time of his or her election, each member of the Board shall have lived in one or more of the resident districts for which he or she is running for one (1) year, shall be not less than eighteen (18) years of age, shall be registered and entitled to vote for members of the Board of Education of the school corporation, and meet any and all additional qualifications prescribed by the statutes of the state of Indiana.
- (C) The term of office of each member of the Board of Education shall be for four (4) years. No limitation is set on the number of terms a person may be elected as a member of the Board of Education.

V. Manner of Election:

- (A) The school district shall be divided into two (2) resident districts, each of which is described as follows:

District One

The Metropolitan School District of Perry Township as presently constituted, except for the area from which the Indianapolis Public School students are transferred to the corporation by order of the United States District Court, Southern District of Indiana, Indianapolis Division, under Case No. IP68-3-225. The approximate lines of demarcation for District One are depicted in Exhibit 1 attached hereto and made a part hereof.

District Two

The area from which Indianapolis Public School students are transferred to the school district by order of the United States District Court, Southern District of Indiana, Indianapolis Division, under Case No. IP68-3-225, and more specifically described as: see Exhibit 2 attached hereto and made a part hereof.

Six (6) members shall be elected to serve from District One, three (3) from this district at alternative primary elections, and one (1) member to serve from District Two so that four (4) members will be elected at one primary election and three (3) the next succeeding primary election except for the elections provided in the transition provisions of this Plan.

- (B) All elections to membership of the Board of Education shall be held as part of the primary election in even years specified above. Candidates to membership on the Board of Education shall file Notice of Candidacy in compliance and accordance with the laws of the state of Indiana, as they may be promulgated for such purpose from time to time. Nominees for School Board members shall be listed on the ballot without party designation.

- (C) If authorized by state law, the Board of Education may, in its discretion, appoint one (1) person from District One and one (1) person from District Two on an interim basis to serve until the next primary election at which Board members are elected. The appointed members must meet all qualifications for membership to the Board of Education.

VI. Time Plan Effective:

- (A) This Resolution and Plan, as set forth herein, shall become effective when and if approved pursuant to the provisions of Indiana Code 20-4-10.1-1 through 20-4-10.1-19 inclusive, and this Plan becomes effective upon adoption, in accordance with the provisions of the Indiana Code.

VII. Board of Education:

The Board of Education shall reorganize itself yearly in accordance with the provisions of Indiana State Statutes by electing the following officers:

- (A) President
- (B) Vice-President
- (C) Secretary
- (D) Treasurer

The election of officers shall be made in accordance with the laws of the State of Indiana as may be promulgated for that purpose from time to time.

The Board of Education shall have the rights, duties, powers and liabilities vested in the governing body for the school corporation under the laws of the State of Indiana.

Each member of the Board of Education shall receive such remuneration and compensation for serving on such Board as annually set forth by the Board, and within the limits provided by law.

VIII. Transition Provisions:

The Board of Education, at the time this Plan is adopted, is elected at alternate primary elections in even-numbered years and consists of five (5) resident, at large members in the school corporation, three (3) members whose terms expire June 30, 1996 and two (2) members whose terms expire June 30, 1998. After this Resolution becomes effective and until the elections as provided in this paragraph, the School Board members in office at the time this Plan takes effect shall constitute the Board of Education. If the Plan becomes effective prior to the deadline for filing to run for School Board office in the May, 1996 primary election, then four (4) members of District One and one (1) member of District Two shall be elected at the primary

election in May, 1996. The three (3) members from District One receiving the highest number of individual votes, together with the member from District Two receiving the highest number of individual votes, shall serve for a four (4) year term of office, each beginning July 1, 1996 and expiring June 30, 2000, or until their successors are elected and sworn in under oath. The member elected from District One with the fourth (4th) highest number of individual votes at the May, 1996 primary election shall serve for a two (2) year term beginning July 1, 1996 and expiring June 30, 1998, or until a successor is elected and sworn in under oath. The two (2) members whose terms expire June 30, 1998 will remain in office until that time. Those seats on the Board of Education representing District One, along with the person elected for the two (2) year term of office, as specified above, shall be elected at the primary election in May, 1998 and shall serve for a four (4) year term. With this primary election and thereafter, members elected to the Board of Education shall serve for four (4) year terms.

IX. Vacancies:

Should any vacancy occur on the Board of Education, the vacancy shall be filled in accordance with the laws of the State of Indiana.

X. Present Plan:

Except as herein modified or amended, all other provisions of the original Plan are now readopted and incorporated herein by reference.

XI. Indiana Code:

Whenever, throughout this Plan, references are made to Indiana Code, such Code sections are now adopted as part of and included in this Plan by reference. Hereafter, if any such Code section shall be amended or modified, such amendment or modification is now adopted as part of this Plan and incorporated herein by reference.

XII. Rejection:

Should this Plan of Reorganization be rejected, the original Plan is now readopted.



Beginning at Massachusetts Avenue and Olney Street, go southwest on Massachusetts Avenue (no students either side) to I-70, go west on I-70 to Rural Street, go north on Rural Street to E. 25th Street, go east on 25th Street to Dearborn Street, go north on Dearborn Street to E. 30th Street, go east on 30th Street to midpoint between Station Street and Sherman Drive, go south to E. 28th Street, go west on E. 28th Street to midpoint between Station Street and Gale Street, go south to E. 25th Street, go west on E. 25th Street to Olney Street, go south on Olney Street to Massachusetts Avenue (beginning point).

Beginning at the corner of E. 25th Street and Olney Street, go south on Olney Street to Massachusetts Avenue, go southwest on Massachusetts Avenue (no students on either side) to I-70, go west on I-70 to Wheeler Street, go north on Wheeler Street to E. 25th Street, go east on 25th Street to Olney Street (beginning point).

B. Clinton Young

Beginning at the corner of E. 38th Street and Emerson Avenue, go south on Emerson Avenue to E. 33rd Street, go west on 33rd Street to Arthington Blvd., go north on Arthington Blvd. to E. 38th Street, go east on E. 38th Street to Emerson Avenue (beginning point).

C. Douglas Mac Arthur

Beginning at E. 28th Street and midpoint between Gale Street and Station Street, go south to E. 25th Street, go west on E. 25th to Dearborn Street, go north on Dearborn Street to E. 28th Street, go east on E. 28th Street to the midpoint between Gale Street and Station Street (beginning point).

D. Glens Valley

Beginning at the corner of E. 25th and Wheeler Street, go south on Wheeler Street to I-70, go west on I-70 to Rural Street, go north on Rural Street to E. 25th Street, go east on E. 25th Street to Wheeler Street (beginning point).

E. Henry Burkhart

Beginning at the corner of E. 30th Street and Adams Street, go south on Adams Street, to E. 28th Street, go west on E. 28th Street to Dearborn Street, go north on Dearborn Street to E. 30th Street, go east on 30th Street to Adams Street (beginning point).

F. Homecroft

Beginning at E. 30th Street and the midpoint between Colorado Avenue and Euclid Avenue, go south to Massachusetts Avenue (no students on either side), go southwest on Massachusetts Avenue to Chester Avenue, go north on Chester Avenue extended to E. 30th Street, go east on E. 30th to the midpoint between Colorado Avenue and Euclid Avenue (beginning point).

G. Mary Bryan

Beginning at the corner of E. 33rd Street and Emerson Avenue, go south on Emerson Avenue to Massachusetts Avenue (no students on either side), go southwest on Massachusetts Avenue to the midpoint between Euclid Avenue and Colorado Avenue, go north to E. 30th Street, go east on E. 30th Street to Arthington Blvd. extended, go north on Arthington Blvd. to E. 33rd Street, go east on E. 33rd to Emerson Avenue (beginning point).

H. Southport Elementary

Beginning at the corner of E. 30th Street and Chester Avenue, go south on Chester Avenue and continue a line to Massachusetts Avenue (no students on either side), go southwest on Massachusetts Avenue to Olney Street, go north on Olney Street to E. 25th Street, go east on 25th Street to the midpoint between Gale Street and Station Street, go north to E. 28th Street, go east on E. 28th Street to the midpoint between Station Street and Sherman Drive, go north to E. 30th Street, go east on E. 30th Street to Chester Avenue (beginning point).

I. Winchester Village

Beginning at E. 30th Street and the midpoint between Station Street and Sherman Drive, go south to E. 28th Street, go west on E. 28th Street to Adams Street, go north on Adams Street to E. 30th Street, go east on 30th Street to the midpoint between Station Street and Sherman Drive (beginning point).
