



MONTHLY REPORT SUMMARY

APRIL 15, 2013

Emma Donnan Middle School has many activities happening to complete this school year and plan for the coming year. After school and Saturday tutoring continues to be a positive focus. The school is averaging approximately 20 students per day, plus the sports programs have 45 minute study tables for every player. The school has also completed the last NWEA benchmark and acuity testing. The ISTEP will begin the week of April 29th. Emma Donnan is also working collaboratively with Indiana Teaching Fellows and Howe Middle School to create a Summer School Program. The program will run from June 6, 2013 until June 28, 2013. Presently, boys football, soccer, and volleyball are the sports happening for the last nine weeks.

Emma Donnan Middle School has held a Parent University to help parents gain understanding of state testing, adolescent development, the School Information System, Achieve 3000 and Study Island. Emma Donnan Middle School is planning to have a greater focus on Parental Involvement for the coming school year. The school believes that by increasing parental involvement will have a direct impact to increase in attendance, which will also impact student achievement. This has been discussed with Community Partners, and hopefully with a collaborative effort parental involvement will begin to increase.

Enrollment has declined by 6% since the beginning of 2013. This is largely due to the mobility of the area. But, even though the enrollment is decreasing both the EL and Special Education students percentages have increased. The students enrolling are students who have many special needs. Emma Donnan Middle School is continuing to have recruitment nights for enrollment for next school year and is beginning to call parents about recommitting to eighth grade.

Emma Donnan is engaged in many community events. This past week the students had fun going to Howe Middle – High School for the Carnival for Cancer event. Emma Donnan Middle School raised over \$700.00 for the event. The school is planning a school wide picnic for the end of year. The Ladies to Girls Club have also been

Summary

This past month has been very busy at Emmerich Manual High School. We continue to run an extensive after school tutoring program tailored to each individual student based on passing the End of Course (ECA) tests, scores on the ECA test, Acuity, and NWEA scores. We have been averaging about 45 per day in attendance. Also, we spend 45 minutes per day with each student working on these same skills during our first home room period. Our benchmark pre and post tests each week are showing significant growth for our students.

At present we have about 95% of our current students scheduled for this next school year. At present we are showing a 98% retention rate of this year's freshmen, sophomores, and juniors coming back next year. We have also scheduled approximately 87% of the students from the eighth grade class at Emma Donnan Middle School for the 2013-14 school year.

Another big push this month has been the planning of our Summer School Program. We are offering an extensive list of classes. TC Howe students will have the opportunity to come to EMHS to take these courses. We are partnering with Indianapolis Teaching Fellows on this endeavor. They will be doing their summer teacher training based at Emmerich Manual High School and be working with our teachers to provide instruction to our students.

The data above reflects our enrollment information as of April 15, 2013. As the report indicates, we have a total of 616 students currently enrolled at T.C. Howe High School. Our EL number is at 54 with our largest number of EL students being enrolled in the 12th grade. We also have a total of 93 students who currently have an IEP and a total of 3 students who currently have a 504.

From March 20, 2013, to April 15, 2013, we have had a total of 71 out of school suspensions with the largest number of suspensions taking place in the 10th grade and the least number of suspensions taking place in the 12th grade. Additionally, during this time period, we have had a total of two expulsions. Our attendance rate for our students is currently 85.8% and our attendance for our faculty is currently 96.8.

As of April 15, 2013 we have had new hires. We recently hired two educational consultants, one that focuses on discipline and the other that focuses on parent engagement. We have also hired a social worker as well as an instructional aide. In addition to our new hires, we have also hosted a number of events in order to increase our

community engagement. One event in particular that we held this quarter which proved to be successful was our Carnival for Cancer. This event was open to the entire community and was an all-day event.
