WHEREAS, the Bartholomew County Vote Center Plan was duly adopted on March 4, 2015;

WHEREAS, Indiana Code 3-11-18.1-15 authorizes Bartholomew County to amend a plan adopted with a county election board's order under 3-11-18.1-3 by unanimous vote of the entire membership of the board approving the plan amendment;

WHEREAS, the Bartholomew County Election Board has determined that the number of vote center and satellite vote center locations should be increased for the 2015 Municipal Election contingent upon location connectivity and space availability.

WHEREAS, the Bartholomew County Election Board has determined by unanimous vote that KnowInk shall be our electronic poll book vendor as of December 2014.

WHEREAS, the Bartholomew County Election Board so approves the Bartholomew County plan amendment for vote centers in Bartholomew County, Indiana.

**BE IT THEREFORE ORDERED BY THE BARTHOLOMEW COUNTY
ELECTION BOARD:**

The vote center and satellite vote center locations shall be as follows:

Pursuant to IC 3-11-10-26, the following is the satellite vote center location to be open 28 days prior to Election Day Monday-Friday 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m., the two Saturdays prior from 8:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m., and the Monday prior from 8:00 a.m. – Noon,





MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS:

In the municipal election, there will be three vote center absentee satellite locations in addition to the Bartholomew County Courthouse to accommodate early voters. Per Indiana Code, voting will take place at the courthouse 28 days prior to the election. Donner Center will be utilized as an absentee satellite location the Monday through Friday prior to the election, (Hours: 11:00 a.m. –7:00 p.m.) and the Saturday prior to the election, (Hours: 8:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.).

Main Source Bank (46 West) and Grace Lutheran Church will serve as additional early voting locations on the two Saturdays prior to the election, (Hours: 8:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m.).

SECURITY PROCEDURES **FOR SATELLITE VOTING**

At the beginning and end of each day, poll workers will collectively match the number of voter's signatures on the electronic poll book to the number of voters on the voting machines. This is to ensure that every vote is counted and the integrity of the election is guaranteed.

At the close of each evening, the Republican Inspector and Democrat Judge will return voting panels to the Voter Registration Office. Only the voting booths, not the panels, will remain assembled at the satellite locations. At the close of absentee satellite voting on the Saturday prior to the election, the voting machines will then be securely locked and stored until the vote counting process on Election Day. This procedure will be executed in all mid-term, presidential and municipal elections.

Since 2011, the Bartholomew County Election Board, the Vote Center Committee, and the Voter Registration/Elections Office have been carefully studying the implementation of vote centers for our county. During this detailed study of the vote center concept, the following criteria needed to implement vote centers were examined: vote center locations, additional absentee satellite locations, equipment, internet connectivity, affordability, and the impact this process will have on the voter.

3-11-18.1-4 Requirements of Plan

1. In Compliance with *I.C. 3-11-18.1-4 (5)*, Bartholomew County will have 8 vote center locations in a municipal election strategically placed throughout the city of Columbus. (See Attached Map) These locations were selected because of their accessibility to high traffic area roadways, internet connectivity, parking, handicap accessibility, space for equipment, voter flow, population, and voter turnout.
2. (See Attached Map of Vote Center Locations)
3. IMPLEMENTATION DATE: March 4, 2015
4. Bartholomew County Municipalities currently have 30,551 registered voters, 24,509 active voters and 6,042 inactive voters: (See Attached)
5. All thirty seven (37) precinct ballots will be available to each vote center location in the city of Columbus, *I.C. 3-11-18.1-4 (5.)* Voters at precinct 3900 will be able to cast their ballot at these vote center locations for Edinburgh town elections also.

6. The number of precinct election boards appointed to administer an election at each vote center location includes – 1 Inspector, 1 Democrat Judge, 1 Republican Judge, 1 Democrat Clerk, and 1 Republican Clerk. All poll workers will be cross trained in order to utilize the workers as needed.
7. The number and name of each precinct will be administered by the precinct election board consistent with section 12 of this chapter – all 38 precincts will be associated with each and every vote center. (See Attached)
8. The list containing the number and title of each precinct and the precinct election officers who will oversee each vote center – 1 Inspector, 1 Democrat Judge, 1 Republican Judge, 1 Democrat Clerk and 1 Republican Clerk.
9. The ballot style variations will be dependent upon if it is a county, municipal or presidential election. These electronic ballots are programmed onto each voting machine. Provisional ballots will be made available upon demand.
10. Equipment description – The Bartholomew County I.T. Department will use a secure Verizon hotspot connection at each vote center location. This will allow an electronic connection between the KnowInk Electronic Poll Pad and a secure web server that will be accessed from the Voter Registration Office. Each electronic poll book will contain a data base that securely holds all registered voters in the county. (See Attached)
11. Bartholomew County will utilize the KnowInk Electronic Poll Pad. This electronic poll book will securely connect to each vote center and to the County Election Board at the Bartholomew County Courthouse. (See Attached)
12. There will be two electronic poll books at each vote center location.

13. Bartholomew County I.T. Department as well as two machine technicians will be available on Election Day. The Bartholomew County I.T. Department will assist vote centers if there is any disruption with internet or technology during satellite voting or on Election Day. Each location will be supplied with Verizon hotspots to ensure internet capabilities. Both political parties will equally oversee the voting process. This includes voter check-in, placing voters on machines, printing off tally tapes, giving poll lists to poll watchers, and returning all of the supplies at the end of the Election Day.
14. All 8 vote centers meet the I.C. 3-11-8 criteria that are in compliance with accessibility requirements for polling locations. Two staff members from the Voters Registration/Elections Office have surveyed each location to ensure it meets the Help America Vote Act.
15. (See Attached for Vote Center Layout)
16. There will be 4 satellite voting centers including the Bartholomew County Voter Registration/Election Office. (See Attached for dates, times and locations)
17. Voter data will be provided at 9 am, 12 noon and 3 pm on Election Day to those who are entitled to receive the information upon request at the Bartholomew County Voter Registration Office.





iOS Receives FIPS 140-2 Certification from NIST

iOS and MacOS have received FIPS 140-2 certification from NIST. This certifies the encryption algorithms for government use. Government agencies can then officially use iOS and MacOS devices for computing of sensitive data with the correct configuration and usage. However, there are already many government agencies using iOS and MacOS including FBI, DOE, NASA, DoD, etc. Indeed, to our knowledge, there are no primary government agencies that are not using Apple technology now.

A Comparison of iOS and Android Platforms
