BREWERS' CUP COMPETITION TERMS AND CONDITIONS

IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE EXHIBITOR TO BE FAMILIAR WITH AND UNDERSTAND THE GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE INDIANA STATE FAIR AND THOSE SPECIFIC TO THE BREWERS' CUP.

1. All 2010 Brewers' Cup entries must be made online at www.brewerscup.org and paid by credit card. Visa, MasterCard and Discover accepted. Sorry, no American Express. If for any reason you cannot comply with this requirement, please contact: brewerscup@indianastatefair.com.

2. Entry fee for the Home Brewer is \$10.00 per beer (3 - 12 oz bottles per entry) and for the Professional entry fee is \$30.00 per beer (3 bottles any size per entry).
3. When shipping or delivering bottled entries to Sun King Brewery, exhibitor must include a copy of the online completed entry form. Bottle ID labels should be affixed to each bottle with a rubber band.
Home Brewer- three 12 oz bottles per entry. Professional Brewer- three bottles any size.
4. Entries will be judged according to the 2008 version of the Beer Judge Certification Program (BJCP) style guidelines at www.bjcp.org/stylecenter.php. Categories are designated by numbers and subcategories are designated with letters.
5. Entries will be accepted for BJCP categories 1-23. NO MEAD AND CIDER ENTRIES ACCEPTED.
6. Do not submit more than one per subcategory except for categories 16-E, 20, 21, 22 and 23. Example: It is NOT acceptable to enter two American Pale Ales, but it IS acceptable to enter one American Pale Ale and one American Amber Ale since these are in different subcategories of the American Pale Ales category. Multiple entries may be submitted in categories 16-E (Belgian Specialty Ale), 20 (Fruit Beers), 21 (Spice/Herb/Vegetable), 22 (Smoke flavored and Wood aged beers), and 23 (Specialty Beers).
7. Award winning beer entries may be displayed in a locked case in the Ball State Agriculture/Horticulture Building throughout the Fair. All entries will become the property of the Indiana State Fair and will not be released after the exhibit.

SECTION PB - PROFESSIONAL BREWER

1. Contest is open to all commercial brewers.
2. Each entry must consist of three (3) samples, in any size bottles. Labeled bottles are acceptable.
3. Every bottle should have a completed bottle ID form affixed to it with a rubber band. A sample bottle ID form can be found in these guidelines.
4. Entry form must be signed by an owner/legal authority of the commercial brewery submitting the entry. Entrants accept all terms and conditions of the Indiana State Fair by submitting an entry. No entries will be returned. Brewers have permission from the Indiana State Fair to use their award in promotional material.
5. Professional class judging will be conducted by teams of qualified judges, including Beer Judge Certification Program judges, experienced competition judges and professional brewers. Participating beer judges may submit entries, but may not judge the flights that include or impact their own entries. Entries must score a minimum of 24 points to be eligible for an award. Gold, Silver, Bronze medals will be awarded to eligible first, second and third place winners in a flight. Gold medal winners will advance to the "Best of Show" round.
6. Only Gold, Silver, & Bronze winners will be listed. A list of all entrants will not be released.

CHAMPION BREWER AWARD

Presented by the Brewers of Indiana Guild to the Indiana Brewery which earns the most points in the 2010 Brewers' Cup Competition.
