NOTICE OF PROPOSED DISMISSAL ORDER

An administrative hearing was scheduled to be held on May 25, 2000, before the Medical Licensing Board of Indiana ("Board") in the Conference Center, Indiana Government Center South, 302 West Washington Street, Indianapolis, Indiana. Said hearing was on the petition for review filed by Barbara Freeman ("petitioner") concerning the Board's denial of her application to practice medicine in Indiana. The petitioner was not present and was not represented by counsel.

The Board, pursuant to IC 4-21.5-3-24, by a vote of 4-0, issues a Notice of Proposed Dismissal Order on the following grounds:

1. The petitioner Barbara Freeman is an applicant for licensure to practice medicine in Indiana. This matter is pending on her petition for review of the Board's denial of her application.
2. On April 4, 2000, an Order was issued in this matter by certified mail giving notice of the date, time and location of the May 25, 2000, hearing.
3. The Board gave sufficient notice of the hearing.
4. The petitioner was provided adequate notice of the hearing date and failed to appear for the scheduled hearing.

ORDER

For the petitioner's failure to appear for her scheduled hearing, the Board issues this Notice of Proposed Dismissal:

In accordance with IC 4-21.5-3-24, the petitioner must file a written motion within ten days of the issuance of this order (seven days plus three days for service by mail) requesting that the Board not enter a dismissal order in this case and stating the reasons relied upon for said request. Failure of the petitioner to file such a written motion within ten days shall result in the issuance of a dismissal order. If the petitioner timely files a motion, the Board shall consider

said motion along with any other relevant facts in determining whether a dismissal order should be entered. Should a dismissal order be entered against the petitioner, the Board may hold further proceedings it deems appropriate, if any, to complete this case without the participation of the petitioner.
