HEARING NOTICE


Pursuant to Ind. Code § 4-21.5-3-20, the Medical Licensing Board of Indiana (“Board”) issues the following Hearing Notice:

- 1) On February 13, 2026, a petition for summary suspension was filed before the Board by the State (“Petitioner”) and against the above-captioned practitioner (“Respondent”).
- 2) A hearing on this petition is scheduled on February 26, 2026, at 8:30am EST in W064, 402 W. Washington Street, Indianapolis, IN 46204. This hearing is to determine whether the Board should grant the summary suspension of the Respondent’s license.
- 3) The Board will be presiding as administrative law judge in this matter. The Board is empowered to hold this administrative hearing pursuant to the authority of Ind. Code ch. 25-1-9 and Ind. Code art. 4-21.5. et seq.
- 4) Any party may be represented by counsel at the party’s own expense. Any attorney for either party must file an Appearance through the [Litigation Webform](#).
- 5) Parties should adhere to the [PLA Administrative Procedure Guidance](#) for formatting requirements and deadlines related to dispositive motions and proposed orders.
- 6) If a party wishes to utilize exhibits at a hearing, all exhibits must be submitted through the Litigation Webform.
 - a. The State shall label its exhibits numerically (e.g., Ex. 1).
 - b. Respondent shall label his or her exhibits alphabetically (e.g., Ex. A).

- c. Any exhibits containing confidential material, including protected health information (“PHI”), shall be submitted with all confidential information or PHI redacted and shall be filed and marked “PUBLICLY ACCESSIBLE”.
- 7) All final exhibits and witnesses’ lists should be submitted in electronic format through the Litigation Webform to the Board and by email or regular mail to the other party NO LATER than 5 BUSINESS DAYS before the hearing.
 - 8) If a party believes the hearing will require testimony and disclosure of PHI or other confidential information, parties are required to ensure they take reasonable steps to de-identify all patient information during testimony.
 - a. If a party is unable to present its case in chief without discussing PHI or the ability to properly de-identify such information, the party can file a motion to request hearing before a single Administrative Law Judge prior to the final decision made by the entire Board. Motions for change in Administrative Law Judge must be filed 30 days before the above scheduled hearing date. Such motions may cause a continuance of the final hearing and are subject to the Board’s discretion for approval.
 - 9) If applicable, any party to the proceeding is entitled to an interpreter to assist the party throughout the proceeding pursuant to Ind. Code § 4-21.5-3-16. The party may supply their own interpreter or request that the Board supply an interpreter. Costs for the interpreter are the responsibility of the requesting party. Identification of a party's interpreter or requests to the Board for an interpreter need to be submitted to Clerk@pla.in.gov with the subject line “Interpreter Request” at least 20 DAYS prior to the hearing.

- 10) General questions regarding hearing schedules and procedures shall be sent via e-mail to Clerk@pla.in.gov and must include all other parties to the litigation. This does not include Motions for Continuance as those must be filed through the Litigation Webform.
- 11) A party who fails to attend or participate in a pre-hearing conference, hearing, or other later stage of this proceeding may be held in default or have the proceeding dismissed under Ind. Code § 4-21.5-3-24.
- 12) It is the responsibility of the parties to ensure the Board has updated contact information for each party throughout the proceeding. If Respondent's contact information changes at any time during the proceeding, Respondent should notify the Board and all other parties by submitting an email to Clerk@pla.in.gov. Petitioner's and/or Respondent's counsel shall file an amended appearance for any changes in contact information or change in representation. Failure to update contact information is not a defense for failure to hear and being held in default.

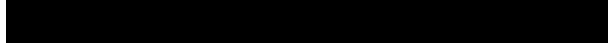

PETITION FOR SUMMARY SUSPENSION

The State of Indiana, herein (“Petitioner”), by counsel, Deputy Attorney General Carah J. Rochester, pursuant to Ind. Code Ch. 4-21.5-4 *et seq.* and Ind. Code Sec. 25-1-9-10, respectively, submits to the Medical Licensing Board of Indiana (“Board”), Petitioner’s “Petition for Summary Suspension” (“Petition”), against the Indiana physician license of Abdelmessiah Guirguis, MD (“Respondent”). In support, Petitioner alleges the following:

1. The OAG is empowered under Ind. Code § 25-1-7-7 to prosecute this action on behalf of Petitioner against Respondent’s license.
2. Respondent is a licensed physician and holds Indiana license 01065798A, which was issued by the Board on September 3, 2008, and expires on October 31, 2027.
3. Respondent’s address on file with the Indiana Professional Licensing Agency (“IPLA”) is King's Daughters' Health, 1373 East State Road 62, Madison, Indiana 47250.

JURISDICTION

4. On April 22, 2025, the OAG received a consumer complaint filed against Respondent, and an investigation was then initiated as authorized by Ind. Code § 25-1-7-5(b)(4). The consumer complaint is attached herewith as Exhibit 1.
5. The investigation uncovered that Respondent’s actions represent a clear and immediate danger to the public health and safety if allowed to continue to practice.

6. At all times relevant, Respondent was a “practitioner” as that term is defined by Ind. Code § 25-1-9-2.

7. Therefore, the Board has authority to hear this case and to summarily suspend Respondent’s license in accordance with Ind. Code § 25-1-9-10 should the Board find Respondent represents a clear and immediate danger to the public health and safety if allowed to continue to practice.

FACTS SUPPORTING CLEAR AND IMMEDIATE DANGER

8. Respondent entered into a physician employment agreement with Norton King’s Daughters’ Health, Inc. and Community Medical Associates, Inc. on or about October 20, 2008.¹

9. At all times relevant, Respondent served as a primary care physician for the aforementioned entities, treating patients in Madison, Indiana.

10. While a physician in Madison, IN, Respondent saw several male patients and the following occurred:

- a. Respondent watched as a patient ejaculated in order to provide a semen sample;
- b. During a genital examination, while rubbing the tip of a patient’s penis, Respondent told the patient their circumcision had not been done correctly as a child and that his penis could be bigger;
- c. When performing a prostate examination on a patient, Respondent grabbed the patient’s penis and “jerked” it back and forth;
- d. Respondent told a patient he needed to perform a “stretch test.” Respondent had the patient pull down their pants, examined the patient’s testicles, then proceeded to grab the patient’s penis, stretching and tugging it back and forth.

¹ Norton King’s Daughters’ Health was previously King’s Daughters’ Hospital and Health Services.

Respondent asked the patient if this was how “big” his penis was when it was “hard,” telling the patient he was “doing good” while giving him a double tap on the thigh;

- e. During a prostate examination, Respondent pulled on a patient’s genitals and commented how a man can “cum” during the examinations;
- f. During an appointment in which a patient was requesting a referral to a urologist for a vasectomy, Respondent had the patient pull down their pants while Respondent kneeled. Respondent grabbed the patient’s penis, moved it around, and held it. Respondent grabbed the patient’s penis with both hands and used his two thumbs to spread the urethral opening apart. Respondent was not wearing gloves;
- g. During a genital examination, Respondent had a patient lay down on the examination table and stroke the patient’s penis. The patient felt as though Respondent was attempting to make the patient’s penis erect. During the touching, Respondent made comments about the patient having a nice penis and nice body hair while also touching the patient’s chest hair;
- h. During a genital examination, a patient felt as though Respondent was “batting around” the patient’s penis. The genital examination lasted for approximately ten (10) minutes, during which the patient became erect due to Respondent’s physical handling of the patient’s penis. Respondent noted to the patient he would rate the patient’s penis an 8/10. During the examination Respondent also squeezed the patient’s penis, causing pre-ejaculate to be emitted;

- i. Respondent used more than one (1) finger when performing some rectal and prostate examinations;
- j. Respondent performed prostate examinations on several patients who did not meet the American Urological Association or the American Cancer Society's qualifications for recommended screening;
- k. For rectal and/or prostate examinations, Respondent had patients position themselves on the examination table kneeling and resting on their forearms/elbows with their gluteal region raised;
- l. Respondent informed patients it was normal to get an erection or ejaculate during a prostate examination. Following some prostate examinations, Respondent would look to see if a patient had ejaculated;
- m. Respondent failed to offer gowns to several patients while they were fully undressed;
- n. A patient felt Respondent was "rough" during the prostate examination as though Respondent was attempting to get the patient to ejaculate;
- o. Respondent failed to tell some patients that he was about to insert his finger(s) into their rectum or thoroughly explain the examination;
- p. Some patients felt Respondent took longer than normal to conduct genital and/or prostate examinations; and
- q. Respondent did not wear gloves during some genital and/or prostate examinations.

11. On or about December 15, 2025, Respondent's Physician Employment Agreement with Norton was terminated due to "grossly unprofessional conduct."

CHARGE – CLEAR AND IMMEDIATE DANGER TO THE PUBLIC

Pursuant to Ind. Code 25-1-9-10, Respondent represents a clear and immediate danger to the public health and safety if allowed to continue to practice.

WHEREFORE, pursuant to Ind. Code 4-21.5-4, Petitioner requests that this Board set an emergency hearing on Petitioner’s Petition, grant Petitioner’s Petition, and summarily suspend Respondent’s license for a period of not more than ninety (90) days, and any other relief provided for by law.

I was Seen on October 17 for a general check up with Abdulmessiah Guirguis at KDH Madison. One of my concerns was the psoriasis in my ear and on my knee. The doctor checked it and asked if I had it anywhere else, Which I did on my penis and above my anus. Guirguis Asked if he could see which I agreed to. He proceeded to touch my penis with an ungloved hand. After this, he asked me to get on the examination table so he could look more. Once I was on the table, he again touched my penis with an ungloved hand, saying that my circumcision was messed up in my penis should be bigger. He then began to rub the tip of my penis, telling me it was the most sensitive area.
