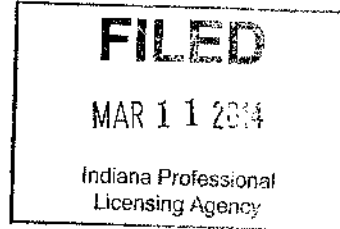

FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW AND ORDER

Shannon Adams appeared at a hearing before the Indiana Board of Pharmacy (“Board”) on March 10, 2014, in Room W064 of the Indiana Government Center South, 402 West Washington Street, Indianapolis, Indiana concerning her request to have the probationary terms withdrawn from her license as a pharmacist.

The state of Indiana appeared by Joshua Timmons, Deputy Attorney General. Adams appeared in person and waived her right to be represented by counsel.

The Board, after considering the file and the testimony of Adams, by a vote of 6 to 0, issued the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Shannon Adams, whose mailing address is 11131 Harrington Lane, Fishers, Indiana 46038, is a duly licensed pharmacist in the State of Indiana holding license number 26019548A.

2. The Indiana Professional Licensing Agency sent, and Adams received, timely and proper notice of the date, time and location of this hearing pursuant to Ind. Code § 4-21.5-3-20.

3. The Board is empowered to hold this administrative hearing pursuant to the authority of Ind. Code § 25-1-9-9 and Ind. Code ch. 4-21.5-3.

4. The Board placed Adams's license on probation in September 2013 because she failed to disclose her criminal history when she renewed her license. She had been convicted of criminal mischief in 2005.

5. In February 2014 Adams asked that the probation be withdrawn from her license.

6. At the hearing on withdrawal, Adams testified that she has complied with the terms of her Indiana probation which included submitting favorable employer reports.

7. The deficiency that led to the probation of Adams's license involved failure to disclose her criminal history. Adams's compliance with her probation constitutes evidence that this problem has been remedied.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. "The board may withdraw or modify the probation ... if it finds, after a hearing, that the deficiency that required disciplinary action has been remedied, or that changed circumstances warrant a modification of the order." Ind. Code § 25-1-9-9(b).

2. Adams's compliance with her probation constitutes evidence that the deficiency that required disciplinary action has been remedied.

ORDER

Based upon the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the Board **WITHDRAWS** the probation on Adams's license.
