EMERGENCY SUSPENSION

The Indiana Committee of Podiatric Medicine (hereinafter "Committee") pursuant to the authority of IC 4-21.5-4-1 et seq. and IC 25-1-9-10 hereby **SUMMARILY SUSPENDS** the license to practice podiatric medicine held by Respondent, Ronald Weber, D.P.M., (hereinafter "Respondent"), license no. 07000245, for ninety (90) days as the Committee finds that an emergency exists and that Respondent represents a clear and immediate danger to the public health and safety if allowed to continue to practice podiatric medicine in the State of Indiana.

This **NON-FINAL** emergency suspension and the above findings are based upon evidence submitted to and credited by the Committee at a meeting held October 19, 1990. The aforesaid evidence establishes that:

1. On or about July 22, 1989, Respondent wrote a prescription for ten (10) biphedamine 25 mg (a schedule II controlled substance) for patient R.A.
2. There is no known use for biphedamine with the scope of practice of Podiatric Medicine.
3. Respondent shall, upon receipt of this Order or upon gaining personal knowledge of the contents of this Order, immediately cease all acts connected with and constituting the practice of podiatric medicine.
4. Respondent shall immediately surrender custody and control of his: wall license and pocket card; Drug Enforcement Administration permit; Indiana Controlled Substance Registration; all prescription pads; multiple copy prescription blanks and all controlled substances in his possession to the Health Profession Bureau, One American Square, Suite 1020, Indianapolis, Indiana, 46282.

5. Pursuant to IC 4-21.5-4-4, upon request by Respondent, the Committee shall, as quickly as practicable, set this matter for an evidentiary hearing and an administrative law judge shall determine whether this Order should be voided, terminated, modified, stayed or continued.
