



3. The Board is empowered to hold this administrative hearing pursuant to the authority of Ind. Code § 25-1-9-9 and Ind. Code § 4-21.5-3.

4. In April 2013 the Board voted to suspend Feldhaus' license because she filled prescriptions for methadone early before having received a hard copy of the prescription. Feldhaus underwent a complete addictionology exam as well as a psychological evaluation.

5. The Pharmacists Recovery Network determined that she did not meet the criteria for a substance abuse disorder but also decided that her practice should be monitored for a time.

6. At the hearing on reinstatement, Feldhaus testified that she had fulfilled all the conditions for reinstatement of her license which included paying a fine. She knew she made an enormous mistake in getting too personally involved with a patient and promised it will never happen again.

7. In December 2013, after the hearing on reinstatement, the Board reinstated her license on probation.

8. In December 2016 Feldhaus asked that the probation on her Indiana license be withdrawn.

9. At the hearing on withdrawal of probation, Feldhaus testified that she has complied with the terms of probation on her license and completed a recovery agreement with the Pharmacist Recovery Network.

10. The deficiency that led to the discipline on Feldhaus's license involved improper dispensing of methadone. Feldhaus's compliance with her probation indicates that this problem has been remedied.

**CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

1. "The board may withdraw or modify the probation ... if it finds, after a hearing, that the deficiency that required disciplinary action has been remedied, or that changed circumstances warrant a modification of the order." Ind. Code § 25-1-9-9(b).

2. Feldhaus's compliance with her probation indicates that the deficiency that required disciplinary action has been remedied.

**ORDER**

Based upon the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the Board **WITHDRAWS** the probation from Feldhaus's license.
