On May 21, 2009, the Indiana Professional Licensing Agency (“IPLA”) sent a notice to Respondent at the address listed above informing Respondent of the date, time, and place of the disciplinary hearing scheduled for June 8, 2009. Said notice was sent, pursuant to statute, to the Respondent’s address listed on her pharmacist license.

4. Pursuant to Ind. Code §4-21.5-3-20, Respondent was provided adequate notice of the disciplinary hearing and failed to appear for the hearing scheduled on June 8, 2009.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED DEFAULT ORDER

For the Respondent’s failure to appear for the hearing scheduled on June 8, 2009, the Board issued the following Notice of Proposed Default Order:

In accordance with Ind. Code § 4-21.5-3-24, the Respondent must file a written motion with seven (7) days of service of this Order requesting the Board not enter a default order in this case and stating the reasons relied upon for that request. Failure of the Respondent to file such a written motion within seven (7) days shall result in the issuance of a default order. If the Respondent timely files a motion, the Board shall consider said motion along with any relevant facts in determining whether a default order should be entered. Should a default order be entered against the Respondent, the Board may hold further proceedings as it deems appropriate to complete this case without the participation of the Respondent.
