ORDER WITHDRAWING PROBATION

The Indiana Board of Pharmacy (“Board”), having held a hearing on August 8, 2022, regarding a petition for withdraw of probation filed by licensee, Sandra Hayes, R.Ph., (“Petitioner”), now issues its Order Withdrawing Probation by a vote of 5-0-0 in favor of granting Petitioner’s request, as follows:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. This matter is before the Board on Petitioner’s petition for withdraw of probation.
2. In an Order titled as “Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order” (“Order”), issued on June 22, 2021, the Board placed Petitioner’s Pharmacist’s license on indefinite probation with no right to petition for withdrawal of the probation until completion of her Indiana professionals recovery program (“IPRP”). Consequently, the Board, upon agreement by Petitioner, imposed various requirements instituting a term of probation in accordance with the foregoing.
3. At the August 8, 2022, hearing Petitioner established that the deficiency which resulted in the disciplinary action has been remedied. Petitioner has complied with the terms of the probation at issue with no violations and submitted documentation showing her completion of her IPRN treatment program. The Board took official notice of all documents submitted by

Petitioner. As such, the Board determines now that Petitioner has complied with the terms placed on Petitioner's probationary license to practice as a Pharmacist.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Indiana Code Section 25-1-9-9(b) states in part that:

The [Board] may withdraw or modify the probation ... if [the Board] finds, after a hearing, that the deficiency that required disciplinary action has been remedied.

2. Because Petitioner has established that the deficiency which required disciplinary action has been remedied pursuant to Ind. Code Section 25-1-9-9(b), the Board may determine that it is appropriate to grant Petitioner's request to withdraw the indefinite probation status placed on Petitioner's Pharmacist License.

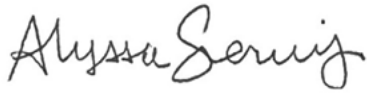
3. The Board hereby finds that Petitioner's request to withdraw probation is appropriate, and issues this Order as set forth below.

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that Petitioner's petition for withdraw of probation is granted and, therefore, Petitioner's license is to return to "Active" status, free and clear from any term of probation.

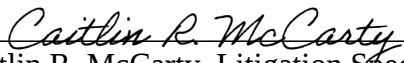
