

- 3) Any party may be represented by counsel at the party's own expense. Any attorney for either party must file an Appearance through the Litigation Webform.
- 4) Parties should adhere to the [PLA Administrative Procedure Guidance](#) for formatting requirements and deadlines related to dispositive motions and proposed orders.
- 5) If a party wishes to utilize exhibits at a hearing, all exhibits must be submitted through the Litigation Webform.
 - a. The State shall label its exhibits numerically (e.g., Ex. 1).
 - b. Respondent shall label his or her exhibits alphabetically (e.g., Ex. A).
 - c. Any exhibits containing confidential material, including protected health information ("PHI"), shall submit the exhibits with all confidential information redacted shall be filed and marked "PUBLICLY ACCESSIBLE".
- 6) All final exhibits and witnesses lists should be submitted in electronic format through the Litigation Webform to the Board and by email or regular mail to the other party **NO LATER than 5 BUSINESS DAYS** before the hearing.
- 7) If a party believes the hearing will require testimony and disclosure of PHI or other confidential information, parties are required to ensure they take reasonable steps to de-identify all patient information during testimony.
 - a. If a party is unable to present its case in chief without discussing PHI or the ability to properly de-identify such information, the party can file a motion to request hearing before a single Administrative Law Judge prior to the final decision made by the entire board. Motions for change in Administrative Law Judge must be filed **30 days** before the above scheduled hearing date. Such motions may cause a continuance of the final hearing and are subject to the Board's discretion for approval.

- 8) If applicable, any party to the proceeding is entitled to an interpreter to assist the party throughout the proceeding pursuant to Ind. Code § 4-21.5-3-16. The party may supply their own interpreter or request that the Board supply an interpreter. Costs for the interpreter are the responsibility of the requesting party. Identification of a party's interpreter or requests to the Board for an interpreter need to be submitted to Clerk@Pla.in.gov with the subject line "Interpreter Request" at least **20 DAYS** prior to the hearing.
- 9) General questions regarding hearing schedules and procedures shall be sent via e-mail to Clerk@pla.in.gov and must include all other parties to the litigation. This does not include Motions for Continuance as those must be filed through the Litigation Webform.
- 10) A party who fails to attend or participate in a pre-hearing conference, hearing, or other later stage of this proceeding may be held in default or have the proceeding dismissed under Ind. Code § 4-21.5-3-24.
- 11) It is the responsibility of the parties to ensure the Board has updated contact information for each party throughout the proceeding. If Respondent's contact information changes at any time during the proceeding, Respondent should notify the Board and all other parties by submitting an email to Clerk@pla.in.gov. Petitioner's and/or Respondent's counsel shall file an amended appearance for any changes in contact information or change in representation. Failure to update contact information is not a defense for failure to hear and being held in default.

DECISION ON APPLICATION FOR RENEWAL

The Indiana State Board of Pharmacy (“Board”) held a personal appearance on August 12, 2024, concerning Brian LaRowe’s (“Applicant”) application to renew licensure as a pharmacist.

The Applicant appeared in person and without counsel.

The Board, after considering the evidence presented and taking official notice of the file in this matter, by a vote of 5 to 0 issues the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Applicant’s mailing address on file with the Board is 14339 Murphy Cir. E., Carmel, IN 46074.
2. The Applicant is a pharmacist with license number 26022971A.
3. On May 28, 2024, the Applicant submitted an application for license renewal, in which he answered yes to multiple questions and thereby triggered a request for personal appearance.

4. At the personal appearance, Applicant disclosed that he was diagnosed with a substance use disorder for alcohol, including enrollment in a 30-day inpatient treatment program and ongoing participation in a 52-week outpatient program, and that Applicant was enrolled with Indiana Professional Recovery Program (“IPRP”), having signed a five-year contract with IPRP.

5. The Applicant agreed to his license being renewed on probation.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

6. “The agency may delay issuing a license renewal for up to one hundred twenty (120) days after the renewal date for the purpose of permitting the board to investigate information received by the agency that the applicant for renewal may have committed an act for which the applicant may be disciplined... Upon agreement of the applicant and the board and following a personal appearance by the applicant before the board, renew the license and place the applicant on probation status under IC 25-1-9-9.” Ind. Code § 25-1-5-4(g)(4).

7. The Applicant committed an act for which the Applicant may be disciplined.

ORDER

Based upon the foregoing and pursuant to Ind. Code § 25-1-5-4, the Board renews the license of the Applicant on indefinite probation. The following **TERMS AND CONDITIONS** govern the Applicant’s practice while on probation:

8. The Applicant’s license as a pharmacist is renewed on **INDEFINITE PROBATION** without the right to petition for probation withdrawal until his IPRP contract is satisfactorily completed.

9. The Applicant must keep the Board apprised of the following information in writing and update it as necessary:

- a. The Applicant's current home address, mailing address, e-mail address and residential telephone number.
- b. The Applicant's place of employment, employment telephone number, employment e-mail address and name of supervisor.
- c. The Applicant's occupation and work schedule, including number of hours worked.

10. Applicant shall present this order to his employer and cause them to submit a signed copy acknowledging the Order back to the Board ten days after receipt of the order.

11. The Applicant shall notify the Board in writing of any discipline incurred in other states during the duration of the probation; including any relevant criminal or license charges pending.

12. The Applicant shall immediately notify the Board in writing of any substance-related relapse.

13. The failure of the Applicant to comply with the terms of this decision may subject him to a show cause hearing and the imposition of further sanctions.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR REVIEW OF THIS DECISION

You may petition for review of this decision under Ind. Code § 4-21.5-3-7. The petition must be filed with the Indiana State Board of Pharmacy in writing, identifying the reasons for review and demonstrating that you have been aggrieved or adversely affected by the Board's decision. The petition for review must be filed no later than eighteen days from the issuance of this decision unless such date is a Saturday, a Sunday, a legal holiday under state statute or a day the Indiana Professional Licensing Agency's offices are closed during regular business hours in which case the deadline would be the first day which is not a Saturday, a Sunday, a legal holiday under state statute or a day the Indiana Professional Licensing Agency's offices are closed during regular business hours.

If your petition for review is timely filed and review granted, you will receive notification of an administrative hearing. You or your representative must be present at that hearing. You have the right to be represented by an attorney at your own expense. A deputy attorney general may be present to represent the state of Indiana. As petitioner, you will have the burden of proving that the Board's decision is incorrect.

Comments: Participant enrolled in a 5-year regulatory RMA on August 9, 2024. This participant has demonstrated significant non-compliance with his RMA. Two previous OTSCs have been filed on this participant on August 26, 2024, and November 6, 2024.

- 6/10/25: PEth resulted in a 331ng/mL (IPRP received results on June 18th)
 - Per our Medical Review Officer (MRO), this result is consistent with an estimated 32-40 ounces of alcohol consumed.
 - Per participant, he was consuming 2-3 Non-Alcoholic (NA) beers per night and taking a liquid ketone supplement once per week. Participant reported that he may have accidentally consumed an alcoholic beverage on one occasion.
 - Per our MRO, 2-3 NA beers per night would not achieve this PEth result level and liquid ketone supplements do not have any effect on PEth results.

CCM informed the participant's treatment providers at Parkdale of this positive result on June 18th. CCM recommended participant to obtain a treatment evaluation to determine the appropriate level of care for treatment. Participant is aware of the recommendation and is working with Parkdale to schedule a treatment evaluation.
