PETITION FOR SUMMARY SUSPENSION

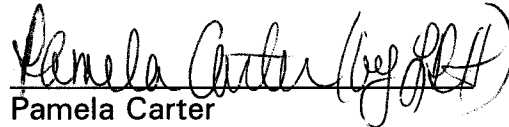
The State of Indiana, by counsel, Amy Huffman Oliver, Deputy Attorney General, moves the Indiana State Board of Pharmacy ("Board") to suspend the license of Jane Doe, a registered pharmacist, for 90 days, and in support of its petition, states the following:

1. Jane Doe is a registered pharmacist in the State of Indiana.
2. This Board has jurisdiction to summarily suspend the license of Jane Doe in accordance with the provisions of the Indiana Code § 4-21.5-4-3 *et seq.* and Indiana Code § 25-1-9-10.
3. If allowed to continue to practice as a registered pharmacist, Jane Doe presents a clear and immediate danger the public health and safety for the following reasons:

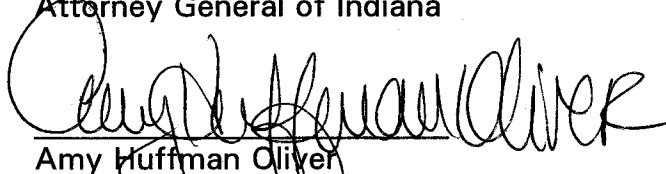
3.1 Jane Doe, whose license was governed by probationary order issued by the Board on July 17, 1995, suffered a relapse into the unauthorized use of controlled substances, namely cocaine, on October 25, 1995, and entered an inpatient treatment program. Jane Doe has an addiction to controlled substances in violation of IC 25-1-9-4(a)(4)(D). Jane Doe's license to practice was suspended on an emergency basis on November 13, 1995. Said suspension expires on February 11, 1996.

WHEREFORE, the State of Indiana requests that this Board set a hearing on this petition and suspend Jane Doe's license for 90 days and for all other proper relief.
