



2. Respondent is a certified pharmacy technician in the State of Indiana having been issued certification number 67012443A on November 1, 2007.

3. On or around March 22, 2013, the Board issued an OTSC against the Respondent for her failure to make probationary appearances before the Board on a quarterly basis.

4. On March 22, 2013, the Indiana Professional Licensing Agency ("IPLA") sent a hearing notice to Respondent at her listed address informing her of the date, time, and place of the administrative hearing on the OTSC scheduled for April 8, 2013, at 2:00 p.m.

5. Pursuant to Ind. Code § 4-21.5-3-20, Respondent was provided adequate notice of the hearing, and Respondent failed to appear for the scheduled hearing in person or by counsel on April 8, 2013.

6. On April 8, 2013, the Board voted 6-0-0 to issue a Notice of Proposed Default Order. On April 18, 2013, the Notice of Proposed Default Order was mailed to Respondent's address of record.

7. Respondent failed to submit a written response within seven (7) days as required by Ind. Code § 4-21.5-3-24.

8. On May 13, 2013, the Board voted, 4-0-0, to hold Respondent in default.

**ULTIMATE FINDINGS OF FACT**

Respondent has violated Ind. Code § 25-1-9-4(a)(10) for failing to personally appear before the Board as ordered.

### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Respondent's violation of her probation is cause for disciplinary sanctions which may be imposed singly or in combination such as censure, a letter of reprimand, probation, suspension, or revocation and a fine up to the amount of \$1,000 per violation as detailed in Ind. Code § 25-1-9-9.

### ORDER

Based upon the above Findings of Fact, Ultimate Findings of Fact, and Conclusions of Law, the Board issues the following Order:

1. Respondent's certification is **INDEFINITELY SUSPENDED**.
2. Respondent shall pay a **FEE** of **FIVE DOLLARS** (\$5.00) to be deposited into the Health Records and Personal Identifying Information Protection Trust Fund. This fee shall be paid by check or money order payable to the State of Indiana, and submitted to the following address:



Respondent's violation of this Final Order or any non-compliance with the statutes or regulations regarding the practice of a pharmacy technician may result in Petitioner requesting a summary suspension of Respondent's license, an Order to Show Cause as may be issued by the Board, or a new cause of action pursuant to Ind. Code § 25-1-9-4, any or all of which could lead to additional sanctions, up to and including a revocation of Respondent's license.
