PETITION FOR SUMMARY SUSPENSION

The State of Indiana ("Petitioner"), by Counsel, Office of the Indiana Attorney General, by Deputy Attorney General Darren R. Covington, moves the Indiana Board of Pharmacy ("Board") to summarily suspend the pharmacy technician license of Donna M. Salyer, C.Ph.T. ("Respondent") for ninety (90) days and in support of its petition states the following:

1. This Board has jurisdiction to suspend Respondent's license in accordance with the provisions of Ind. Code ch. 4-21.5-4 and Ind. Code § 25-1-9-10.
2. Respondent's address on file with the Indiana Professional Licensing Agency is 11 North 5th Street, Batesville, Indiana 47006.
3. Respondent is a licensed pharmacy technician in the State of Indiana having been issued license number 67005336A on December 29, 2003.
4. At all times relevant herein, Respondent was employed as a pharmacy technician with Margaret Mary Community Hospital ("the Hospital") in Batesville, Indiana.
5. Over the past several years, Respondent has held a medical prescription for zolpidem.

6. On or around August 10, 2012, Respondent forged a pharmacy technician's signature on delivery invoices for unauthorized orders of prescription zolpidem.

7. On or around December 5, 2012, Respondent forged a pharmacy technician's signature on delivery invoices for unauthorized orders of prescription zolpidem.

8. On or around December 24, 2012, pharmacy technicians alerted the Director of Pharmacy Services for the Hospital ("the Director") that a zolpidem invoice contained the forged signature of a pharmacy technician who was not scheduled to work on the date the invoice was signed.

9. On or around January 4, 2013, the Director submitted a DEA Form 106 Report of Theft or Loss of Controlled Substances, which reported 1,900 missing zolpidem tablets, a schedule IV controlled substance.

10. On or about January 7, 2013, the Director noticed several missing doses of hydrocodone and ten additional missing tablets of zolpidem following Respondent's weekend shift.

11. On or around January 8, 2013, Respondent admitted to the Director that she ordered bulk zolpidem and took the prescriptions home with her over the previous 6 to 9 months.

12. On or around January 8, 2013, the Hospital terminated Respondent's employment.

13. Due to the above facts, Respondent represents a clear and immediate danger to the public health and safety if allowed to continue to practice as a pharmacy technician in Indiana.

WHEREFORE, the State of Indiana requests that this Board set a hearing on this Petition for Summary Suspension and suspend Respondent's license for a period of ninety (90) days and for all other proper relief.

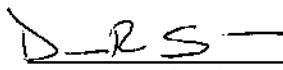
