DECISION ON RENEWAL APPLICATION

Benjamin Van Wye made a personal appearance before the Indiana Board of Pharmacy (“Board”) on April 14, 2014, in Room W064 of the Conference Center of the Indiana Government Center South, 402 West Washington Street, Indianapolis, Indiana, concerning his application to renew his permit as a pharmacist intern.

The Board, after considering the file and statements of the Applicant, votes 6 to 0 to place his pharmacist intern permit on probation.

BACKGROUND

1. The Applicant, whose mailing address is 10582 North East Front Street, Dupont, Indiana 47231, applied to renew his pharmacist intern permit in 2014.
2. The Applicant revealed that in July 2013 he had been arrested for operating a vehicle while intoxicated in Jefferson County. As a result he pled guilty to that charge and will be on criminal probation until September 2013.
3. Van Wye attends Purdue University College of Pharmacy and he reported this incident to the college.

- e. Van Wye shall provide a copy of all Board orders, including this one, imposing discipline or limiting practice to any pharmacy employer and/or Purdue University College of Pharmacy who shall sign and return a copy of such orders to the Board within ten (10) days of employment or receipt of the Order.
 - f. Van Wye shall notify each of his preceptors that he is on probation.
 - g. Van Wye shall submit self reflections/reports detailing his current status, his progress in recovery, issues or problems he is experiencing, and the value he has gained by attending counseling or group recovery sessions. The reports will be due quarterly.
 - h. Van Wye shall immediately notify the Board in writing of any relapse.
 - i. Van Wye shall notify the Board in writing of any discipline incurred in other states during the duration of his probation; including any relevant criminal or licensing charges pending.
 - j. Van Wye shall perform one hour of community service a month while he is on probation and submit written proof thereof with his quarterly reports.
3. It is further Ordered that:
- a. Any information received by any other regulatory agency that indicates non-compliance with the statutes or regulations regarding the competent practice of pharmacy;
 - b. a positive urine drug screen; or
 - c. a violation of the Final Order,

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR REVIEW OF THIS DECISION

You may petition for review of this decision under Ind. Code § 4-21.5-3-7. The petition must be filed with the Indiana Board of Pharmacy in writing, identifying the reasons for review and demonstrating that you have been aggrieved or adversely affected by the Board's decision. The petition for review must be filed no later than eighteen days from the issuance of this decision unless such date is a Saturday, a Sunday, a legal holiday under state statute or a day the Indiana Professional Licensing Agency's offices are closed during regular business hours in which case the deadline would be the first day which is not a Saturday, a Sunday, a legal holiday under state statute or a day the Indiana Professional Licensing Agency's offices are closed during regular business hours.

If your petition for review is timely filed and review granted, you will receive notification of an administrative hearing. You or your representative must be present at that hearing. You have the right to be represented by an attorney at your own expense. A deputy attorney general may be present to represent the state of Indiana. As petitioner, you will have the burden of proving that the Board's decision is incorrect.
