FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW AND ORDER

William Way (“Way”) appeared at a hearing before the Indiana Board of Pharmacy (“Board”) on November 9, 2015, in Room W064 of the Indiana Government Center South, 402 West Washington Street, Indianapolis, Indiana concerning his request to withdraw the terms of probation on his license as a pharmacist.

The state of Indiana appeared by Hannah Anderson, Deputy Attorney General. Way appeared in person and by counsel, Lorie Brown.

The Board, after considering the file and the testimony of Way, by a vote of 5 to 0, issues the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. William Way, whose mailing address is 6524 English Drive, Avon, Indiana 46123, is a duly registered pharmacist in the State of Indiana holding license number 26012430A.
2. The Indiana Professional Licensing Agency sent, and Way received, timely and proper notice of the date, time and location of this hearing pursuant to Ind. Code § 4-21.5-3-20.

3. The Board is empowered to hold this administrative hearing pursuant to the authority of Ind. Code § 25-1-9-9 and Ind. Code § 4-21.5-3.

4. In February 2015 the Board placed Way's license on probation because while employed at K-Mart he displayed bursts of anger and exhibited unprofessional conduct. He also made errors in filling prescriptions.

5. Way left K-Mart and was working PRN at Low Cost Pharmacy at the time the Board placed him on probation.

6. In September 2015 Way asked that the probation on his Indiana license be withdrawn.

7. At the hearing on withdrawal of probation, Way testified that he has complied with the terms of probation on his license which included completing additional continuing education units and submitting favorable employer reports. He has not had any complaints about his practice from his current employer and he has seen a psychologist for anger management.

8. The deficiency that led to the discipline on Way's license involved substandard practice. Way's compliance with his probation indicates that this problem has been remedied.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. "The board may withdraw or modify the probation ... if it finds, after a hearing, that the deficiency that required disciplinary action has been remedied, or that changed circumstances warrant a modification of the order" Ind. Code § 25-1-9-9(b).

2. Way's compliance with his probation indicates that the deficiency that required disciplinary action has been remedied.

ORDER

Based upon the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the Board
WITHDRAWS the **PROBATION** from Way's license.
