SUMMARY SUSPENSION ORDER

An administrative hearing was held on March 11, 2013, before the Indiana Board of Pharmacy ("Board") in Room W064 of the Indiana Government Center South, 402 West Washington Street, Indianapolis, Indiana 46204, to consider the Petition for Summary Suspension ("Petition") filed against Bradley John Ypma, R.Ph. ("Respondent"), by the State of Indiana ("Petitioner") on March 7, 2013.

The State of Indiana was represented by Darren R. Covington, Deputy Attorney General. Respondent failed to appear by person or by counsel.

The Board, pursuant to Ind. Code § 4-21.5-4-1 *et seq.* and Ind. Code § 25-1-9-10, by a vote of 5-0-0, **SUMMARILY SUSPENDS** the license held by Respondent for ninety (90) days as the Board finds that an emergency exists and that Respondent represents a clear and immediate danger to the public health and safety if allowed to practice pharmacy in the State of Indiana.

This **NON-FINAL** emergency order is based on evidence supporting the following findings:

1. This Board has jurisdiction to suspend Respondent's license in accordance with the provisions of Ind. Code ch. 4-21.5-4 and Ind. Code § 25-1-9-10.

2. Respondent's address on file with the Indiana Professional Licensing Agency is 2089 W. Van Arsdall Court, Columbus, Indiana 47201.

3. Respondent is a licensed pharmacist in the State of Indiana having been issued license number 26022716A on May 19, 2008.

4. At all times relevant herein, Respondent was employed as a pharmacist with Columbus Regional Hospital ("the Hospital") in Columbus, Indiana.

5. On or around January 11, 2013, Columbus Police were dispatched to Van Arsdall Court on report of a disturbance. When the police arrived, they found Jessica Ypma, Respondent's wife, in an intoxicated state.

6. The police went to her home to inform Respondent that they found her in an intoxicated state. Respondent allowed the police to come into their home. Once they entered, the police observed dollar bills rolled up, a credit card, a mortar and pestle, and a white powdery substance on the couch.

7. Respondent was questioned about this and indicated that he and his wife had been snorting crushed Ambien and injecting nalbuphine. Respondent consented to a search, and the police also discovered marijuana and empty vials of nalbuphine, which were from the Hospital.

8. As a result, Respondent was arrested. Following the arrest, Respondent's employment was terminated from the Hospital.

WHEREFORE, RESPONDENT IS ORDERED to immediately cease all acts constituting the practice of pharmacy for a period of ninety (90) days, effective March 11, 2013.

ORDERED, this 27 day of March, 2013; this Summary Suspension Order
is effective as of March 11, 2013.
