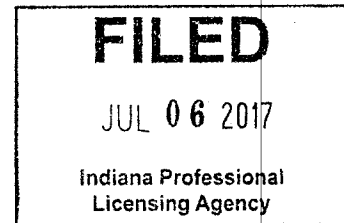

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FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW AND ORDER

Bradley Ypma appeared at a hearing before the Indiana Board of Pharmacy ("Board") on June 12, 2017, in Room W064 of the Indiana Government Center South, 402 West Washington Street, Indianapolis, Indiana concerning his request to withdraw the terms of probation on his license as a pharmacist.

The State of Indiana appeared by Stacy Oliver, Deputy Attorney General. Ypma appeared in person and waived his right to be represented by counsel.

The Board, after considering the file and the testimony of Ypma, by a vote of 6 to 0, issues the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Bradley Ypma, whose mailing address is 2089 West Van Arsdaall Court, Columbus, Indiana 47201, is a duly registered pharmacist in the State of Indiana holding license number 26022716A.

2. The Indiana Professional Licensing Agency sent, and Ypma received, timely and proper notice of the date, time and location of this hearing pursuant to Ind. Code § 4-21.5-3-20.

3. The Board is empowered to hold this administrative hearing pursuant to the authority of Ind. Code § 25-1-9-9 and Ind. Code § 4-21.5-3.

4. In June 2013 the Board voted to suspend Ypma's license because he diverted medications from his employer and abused controlled substances. He was also charged criminally with unlawful possession or use of a controlled drug and possession of marijuana.

5. Ypma entered into a recovery monitoring agreement with the Pharmacists Recovery Network ("PRN").

6. Ypma also pled guilty to misdemeanor possession of paraphernalia and was on criminal probation.

7. At the hearing on reinstatement, Ypma testified that he had fulfilled all the conditions for reinstatement of his license which included complying with his recovery monitoring agreement with PRN. Carol Dunham of PRN testified that Ypma had been very diligent in complying with his PRN agreement and PRN had no concerns about him going on probation.

8. The Board concluded that Ypma's license should be reinstated on probation and issued an order to that effect on May 16, 2014.

9. In March 2017 Ypma asked that the probation on his Indiana license be withdrawn.

10. At the hearing on withdrawal of probation, Ypma testified that he has complied with the terms of probation on his license which included complying with his PRN contract the entire time he has been on probation.

11. He currently works at Cummins but stated that in the future he hopes to attend veterinary school.

12. The deficiency that led to the discipline on Ypma's license involved substance abuse. Ypma's compliance with his probation indicates that this problem has been remedied.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. "The board may withdraw or modify the probation ... if it finds, after a hearing, that the deficiency that required disciplinary action has been remedied, or that changed circumstances warrant a modification of the order." Ind. Code § 25-1-9-9(b).

2. Ypma's compliance with his probation indicates that the deficiency that required disciplinary action has been remedied.

ORDER

Based upon the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the Board **WITHDRAWS** the probation from Ypma's license.
