**What is America250:** In anticipation of the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence, the Indiana Arts Commission is accepting applications for arts projects, in any discipline, that celebrate American history and connect participants to that history.

The America 250 Grant Program is a one-time program made possible through funding from the National Endowment for the Arts and the Indiana General Assembly.

**Who Can Apply**: 501(c)(3) Organizations, units of government, libraries, schools (See page 3 for a full eligibility list).

**Note:** Current organizational grantees of the IAC, excluding those who are fiscally sponsored, are eligible for this opportunity. All applicants must secure a <u>Unique Entity</u> Identifier (UEI) prior to application.

- Applications open November 13, 2025.
- Grant period: March 1, 2026 through December 31, 2026.

# **Grant Award Amounts, Matching Funds and Grant Payment**

Applicants can request up to \$5,000. No matching funds are required.

Applicants recommended for funding will receive the full amount requested and are eligible to be paid in full at the beginning of the grant period provided they are in good standing and supply required information in a timely manner.

#### **America 250 Funding Priorities**

The IAC will prioritize artistic quality and statewide geographic reach.

# Eligibility

# **Eligible Applicants\***

- Nonprofit 501(c)(3) arts organizations in any arts discipline;
- Other 501(c)(3) nonprofit entities that provide arts programming such as social service organizations, main streets, etc.;
- Local units of government;
- Public libraries;
- Public and private schools from pre-kindergarten through high school;
- Colleges and universities

#### \*Note:

- Current organizational grantees of the IAC, excluding those who are fiscally sponsored, are eligible for this opportunity.
- Applicants must have a valid Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) through SAM.gov by the application deadline. <u>Learn more about SAM UEI</u>.
- Fiscally sponsored applicants are not eligible.

# **Additional Eligibility Requirements:**

- Nonprofit organizations must be incorporated in the State of Indiana at the time of application and for the duration of the grant period. They must also be physically located in Indiana. The majority of programming, services, or activities must take place in Indiana and serve and engage Indiana audiences and participants.
- All applicants must be in good standing with all of the following: the State of Indiana; the Indiana Arts Commission; the applicant's <u>Regional Arts Partner</u>; and the National Endowment for the Arts.

#### **Use of Grant Funds**

#### **Eligible Uses of IAC Grant Funds**

America 250 grants support eligible expenses of a public-facing short-term arts project or arts activity (ies) which can include but is not limited to artist fees, program supplies, and facility rental.

# **Ineligible Uses of IAC Grant Funds**

IAC funds may not be used on food and beverage (including alcoholic beverages); cash awards or prizes (including gift cards); and fundraising costs and events. **This is not an exhaustive list of ineligible expenses. Consult the Requirements and Policies for Indiana Arts Commission**

#### **Review Process and Evaluation Criteria**

## **Eligibility Review**

Following the application deadline, applications receive an eligibility review to ensure the applicant is eligible to apply for the program and all required information was submitted. Incomplete or missing information may deem the application ineligible to advance to the review process.

#### **Evaluation Criteria**

Applications will be evaluated by an internal review committee on how well they meet the following criteria:

- Artistic Quality The extent to which the project demonstrates artistic excellence and merit.
- America250 Celebration and Connection The extent to which the project celebrates American history and connects its intended audience to that history.
- Project Management and Feasibility The extent to which the project spending is
  aligned with the project description and the project timeline is defined and feasible within
  the grant period.

## **Access the Evaluation Criteria.**

Access the scoring rubric that will be used by application reviewers.

The review process is highly competitive, approximately 12 applications will be funded.

# **Grant Recipient Requirements**

## **Final Report Requirements**

Grantees will be required to report on their activity(ies) at the end of the grant period. This reporting includes qualitative and quantitative information and an accounting of how IAC funds were used. Collected information is shared with the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) to determine trends and funding impact. Grantees should be engaged in participant tracking during the activity(ies).

Final grant reports submitted after the due date may be subject to penalty. Read the <u>Not in</u> Good Standing policy.

#### **Additional Requirements**

IAC grants come with additional requirements such as acknowledgement of public funding. Consult the Requirements and Policies for Indiana Arts Commission Grantees for additional information.
