About the Grant Program

In anticipation of the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence, the Indiana Arts Commission is accepting applications for arts projects in any discipline that celebrate American history and connect participants to it.

Funding for this grant program comes from the National Endowment for the Arts and the Indiana General Assembly.







About the Grant Program



Program Goals

- Celebrate American History
- Provide Indiana's people and communities access to arts and experiences

Program Outcomes

- Hoosiers celebrate, learn, and reflect on American history through the arts
- Indiana's arts providers have expanded opportunities to enhance the quality of life in their communities§



Grant Program Eligibility

Eligible Applicants

- Nonprofit 501(c)(3) arts organizations in any discipline;
- Other 501(c)(3) nonprofit entities that provide arts programming, such as social service organizations, main streets, etc.;
- Local units of government;
- Public libraries;
- Public and private schools from Pre-K through 12th grade; and
- Colleges and universities



Grant Program Eligibility

Please Note

- Current organizational grantees of the IAC, excluding those who are fiscally sponsored, are eligible for this opportunity
- Applicants must have a valid Unique Entity Identifies (UEI) through SAM.gov by the application deadline
- Fiscally Sponsored applicants are not eligible
- Arts Organization Support grantees should propose a project not already in their season or part of annual programming to be most competitive



Grant Program Eligibility

Additional Eligibility Requirements

- Nonprofit organizations must be incorporated with the State of Indiana at the time of application and for the duration of the grant period
- Organizations must also be physically located in Indiana
- The majority of programming, services, or activities, must take place in Indiana and serve and engage Indiana audiences and participants

Application Due	Monday, December 15, 2025 by 11:59 PM ET*
Funding Notification	By Monday, February 16, 2026
Grant Period	March 1, 2026 – December 31, 2026
Final Grant Report Due	Friday, January 15, 2027 by 11:59 PM ET

^{*}Late applications are not accepted. All applications are final following the submission deadline.



About the Grant Awards

Current Award Amount

Applicants may request up to \$5,000

Matching Funds

No matching funds required

Grant Payment

 Applicants recommended for funding will receive the full amount requested and are eligible to be paid in full at the beginning of the grant period issued via direct deposit

Estimated Number of Applications Funded

~12 Applications



Grantee Requirements

- •All applicants must be in good standing with the following:
 - The State of Indiana
 - The Indiana Arts Commission; and
 - The National Endowment for the Arts (NEA)
- Grantee must follow the full requirements as outlined in the program guidelines, the grant contract, and the Requirements and Policies for Indiana Arts Commission Grantees
- Publicly acknowledge funding support through the use of IAC and NEA logos and other forms of acknowledgement
- Enter a binding contract with the State of Indiana



Grantee Requirements

- Ensure grant funds are used only for eligible expenses
 - Food and beverage, cash awards and prizes, and fundraising are not eligible expenses (see IAC Requirements and Policies for full list)
 - IAC reserves the right to request documentation of grant expenditures and may conduct spot audits to ensure expense eligibility and policy compliance
 - IAC may request a site visit to learn more about the funded project and use of funding
- Monitor record retention and tax responsibilities
 - Grantees must keep all grant-related records for three years from the date of submission of the final report
- Grantee must follow the Americans with Disability Act (ADA) requirements and Federal Civil Rights and all other relevant state/federal laws and policies

Reporting Requirements

- •All grantees submit a final report covering topics including but not limited to:
 - Number of people served
 - Location of activities/services
 - Grant impact
 - Final project budget including use of funds

Evaluation Process

- Applications will be evaluated by how well they meet the criteria
 - Evaluation criteria include:
 - Artistic Quality
 - America 250 Celebration and Connection
 - Project Management and Feasibility
 - Evaluation Criteria and Scoring Rubric are linked in the guidelines and the application







Evaluation Criteria

The extent to which the project:

Artistic Quality

- Demonstrates artistic excellence
- Demonstrates artistic merit

America 250 **Celebration &** Connection

- Celebrates American history
- Connects its intended audience to American history

Project Management & **Feasibility**

- Details spending aligned with the project description
- Provides a defined and feasible timeline for project activities

Application Sections

- <u>Section 1</u>: Before You Begin (info links, tips, deadlines)
 - Section 2: Project Overview (Project type, dates)
 - Section 3: Artistic Quality –
 (Project description, Artistic Personnel, Documentation*)
 - Section 4: America 250 Celebration and Connection —
 (American history celebration, project audience, and outcomes)
 - Section 5: Project Management and Feasibility (Budget, Timeline)



IAC Online Grant System

- All applications are submitted through the IAC Online Grant System
- Applicants must create an account and be logged in to fill out and complete an application

Recommendations

- Before you start
 - Review the America250 Guidelines in full
 - Review the America250 Evaluation Criteria and Scoring Rubric
 - Review the entire application
 - As you complete the application
 - Be clear and thorough
 - Answer every question
 - Provide details to support claims and key narrative points
 - Avoid assumptions that application reviewers already know the organization or project
