# CALL TO ORDER/NOTING OF QUORUM

Chairman Cook called the meeting to order and noted the quorum and the attendance. Present were Vice Chairman Krauss and Commissioner Grubb. Industry Liaison Stewart, Executive Secretary Allen and Commission Counsel Hyer were in attendance.

Jenny Drewry, Scott Bedwell, Andrew Alvarez, Katie Beth Maddox, Carmen Batts-Porter, Greg Genrich, Tyler Starkey and Tony Mitson were present as observers.

#### DISPOSITION OF MINUTES

Vice Chairman Krauss moved to approve the minutes from the October 16, 2019 meeting. Commissioner Grubb seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

#### PROSECUTOR'S RECOMMENDATIONS

<u>PARTIES' AGREED DISPOSITIONS</u> – Executive Secretary Allen noted there are 82 Parties' Agreed Dispositions, totaling \$31,550.00 in fines, for the Commission's approval.

The Executive Secretary highlighted a few dispositions: GD14-00266, sold products to establishment without gaming permit, deferral, but told to be more diligent in checking for permits; RR84-01565 & BR1736410, sale to intoxicated person (well after showing signs of intoxication), \$1,000 fine for business and \$750 fine for employee; DL52-01579, minor loitering (daughter of clerk), deferral; DL29-03413, 3<sup>rd</sup> service to minor, \$2,000 fine; DL71-30033, 3<sup>rd</sup> service to minor, \$2,000 fine; TC02452001, 5<sup>th</sup> sale of single cigarettes, \$1,000 fine; TC02422001, 3 current sale of single cigarettes (7 prior), \$1,500 fine and a 10 day suspension. Permittee was advised that any further will result in revocation of permit.

Vice Chairman Krauss moved to approve the PAD forms submitted by the Prosecutor. Commissioner Grubb seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

DL45-11752, bootlegging, scope of permit, alteration/misbranded beverages and unauthorized dealings with non-permittee.

Vice Chairman Krauss moved to continue this one to allow time to speak with the prosecutor. Commissioner Grubb seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

Vice Chairman Krauss seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

Commissioner Grubb moved to approve and incorporate by reference these lists of permit applications for a new permit or application for changes in location, ownership or both of existing permits, which have been recommended by local boards and reviewed by at least two Commissioners and hereby move for approval of same, pending final floor plan approval by the Indiana State Excise Police and escrow, if needed, and inclusion of these lists as part of the minutes. Vice Chairman Krauss seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

Commissioner Grubb moved to approve and incorporate by reference these lists of applications for catering. Vice Chairman Krauss seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

Commissioner Grubb moved to approve the new and renewal carrier permits. Vice Chairman Krauss seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

Commissioner Grubb moved to approve the direct wine shipper new and renewal permits. Vice Chairman Krauss seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.
