CALL TO ORDER/NOTING OF QUORUM

Chairman Allen called the meeting to order and noted the quorum and the attendance. Vice Chairman Payne, Commissioner Maginn, Commissioner Grubb, Deputy Director Kirkman, General Counsel Merritt, and Prosecutor Wignall were present.

DISPOSITION OF MINUTES

<u>RR45-38934 TOP NOTCH MANAGEMENT CORP.</u>- Chair Allen noted this is a new application with the local board voting 2-1 to approve.

Commissioner Maginn stated the dance school, which shares a common wall with the location, remonstrated at the local board hearing. The dance school felt that because they are a school that the 200-foot rule applied; however, the statute requires the school to be an elementary or secondary school for this to apply.
