MINUTES

ALCOHOL AND TOBACCO COMMISSION

JULY 5, 2023

CALL TO ORDER/NOTING OF QUORUM

Chair Allen called the meeting to order and noted the quorum and the attendance. Vice Chairman Payne, Commissioner Maginn, Executive Director Kirkman, Prosecutor Wignall, and General Counsel Merritt were in attendance.

DISPOSITION OF MINUTES

Commissioner Maginn moved to approve the minutes from the June 20, 2023 meeting. Vice Chairman Payne seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

PROSECUTOR'S RECOMMENDATIONS

<u>PARTIES' AGREED DISPOSITIONS</u> – Vice Chairman Payne moved to approve the Parties' Agreed Dispositions, submitted by Prosecutor Wignall. Sixty dispositions were submitted with fines totaling \$31,450.00. Commissioner Maginn seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

HEARING JUDGE'S RECOMMENDATIONS

<u>RR02-35122 LAS LOMAS LLC</u> – Vice Chairman Payne, who sat as Hearing Judge, noted this was a violation where no one appeared for the settlement conference and the Order to Show Cause hearing. Per the Order of the Show Cause Hearing, the hearing judge allowed more time to resolve this matter. If the matter is not settled as of the extended date, the permit is revoked. Neither the Prosecutor nor the Hearing Judge has received any notification from the permittee.

Vice Chairman Payne moved to revoke this permit. Commissioner Maginn seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

<u>RR71-33908 J AND B HIDEAWAY, LLC</u> – Vice Chairman Payne, who sat as Hearing Judge, noted this was a violation where no one appeared for the settlement conference and the Order to Show Cause hearing.

Vice Chairman Payne moved to revoke this permit. Commissioner Maginn seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

<u>DL32-28487 JO-FRAN, INC.</u> – Chair Allen, who sat as Hearing Judge, stated this permit was denied by the local board and Commission because it was determined the business was not operating in the character of business of a package liquor store. The permittee was attempting to do indirectly what could not be done directly. There were questions about operations during the Public Health Emergency, so it was not clear what the business would have been, if not for the Emergency. The permittee has requested the ability to file a transfer.

Chair Allen moved to allow the filing of a transfer within 30 days of today, with the completion of that transfer within 120 days. The renewal of the permit should be scheduled for the local board at the time the transfer is scheduled, for purposes of transfer only. Commissioner Maginn seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

CONSIDERATION OF APPLICATIONS

Commissioner Maginn moved to approve and incorporate by reference these lists of permits for renewal, which have been recommended by local boards and reviewed by said staff with the authority of the Commission, and hereby move for approval of same, pending any escrow hearings, and the inclusion of these lists as part of the minutes. Vice Chairman Payne seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

Chair Allen moved to remove and remand permit #RR02-40132 from the agenda due to non-disclosure of criminal history on the application. Applicant is to submit a corrected, truthful application. Vice Chairman Payne seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

Commissioner Maginn moved to approve and incorporate by reference these lists of permit applications for a new permit or application for changes in location, ownership, or both of existing permits, which have been recommended by local boards and reviewed by at least two Commissioners and hereby move for approval of same, pending final floor plan approval by the Indiana State Excise Police and escrow, if needed, and inclusion of these lists as part of the minutes. Vice Chairman Payne seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

Commissioner Maginn moved to approve the catering applications. Vice Chairman Payne seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

Commissioner Maginn moved to approve the carrier applications. Vice Chairman Payne seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

Commissioner Maginn moved to approve the direct wine seller applications. Vice Chairman Payne seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.
