Charlie Kirk was shot today.

First off—fuck that guy. He's a fascist carnival barker who built a career turning college campuses into right-wing indoctrination fairs, demonizing queer kids, immigrants, and anyone who doesn't fit his cookie-cutter idea of America. He's spent years calling for the state to crack skulls, cages for migrants, cops to crush protests—and now the headlines want me to clutch pearls because violence finally touched him? Spare me.

This is how power works in America. When cops split a worker's skull open on a picket line? That's called "maintaining order." When the right harasses drag queens and doctors with AR-15s? That's "protecting children." When Palestinians are bombed to ash with our tax dollars? That's "national security." But when one of their own propagandists takes a bullet, suddenly we're supposed to stop the presses, mourn the man, and forget the blood he's helped justify spilling.

Let's be clear: I don't glorify random shootings. Violence in this country is ugly, chaotic, and usually leaves working people—not elites—paying the price. But the crocodile tears for Kirk tell you everything about hierarchy in America. A fascist mouthpiece gets wounded, and it's a "national incident." Meanwhile, thousands of poor, Black, brown, queer, disabled, and immigrant lives destroyed by police, prisons, and poverty every year barely register as a footnote.


